# Operational Protocols for Border Violence Incidents

## Border Violence Occurring in U.S.

### Step One: Incident Notification

- Any incident identified in the Catalog of Incidents annex will require the use of the Border Violence Incident Protocols.

At the Ports of Entry: CBP Officers will call C4 (or local equivalent). A secondary notification will be made to CISEN Headquarters in Mexico City<sup>1</sup>. Once international notification has been made, local law enforcement will be notified (city, state, and federal) as appropriate. CBP OFO will use bi-national maps to vector responding agencies to area of incident. C4 and CISEN Headquarters will be expected to notify each other as well.

Between the Ports: CBP Border Patrol Agents will call C4 (or local equivalent). A secondary notification will be made to CISEN Headquarters in Mexico City<sup>2</sup>. Once international notification has been made, local law enforcement will be notified (city, state, and federal) as appropriate. CBP Border Patrol will use bi-national maps to vector responding agencies to area of incident<sup>3</sup>. C4 and CISEN Headquarters will be expected to notify each other as well.

### Step Two: Incident Response

At the Ports of Entry: C4 and CISEN Headquarters will coordinate to deploy the Law Enforcement Agency that will provide the most efficient and effective response. Hand-held radios may be used after initial notifications to expedite GoM Law Enforcement response.

Between the Ports: C4 and CISEN Headquarters will coordinate to deploy the Law Enforcement Agency that will provide the most efficient and effective response. Hand-held radios may be used after initial notifications to expedite GoM Law Enforcement response.

### Step Three: CBP Headquarters Notification

At the Ports of Entry: CBP Officers will report the incident via established reporting procedures<sup>4</sup>.

<sup>4</sup>CBP OFO Officers will adhere to existing Field Office and CBP Situation Room notification procedures.

# Operational Protocols for Border Violence Incidents

Between the Ports: CBP Border Patrol Agents will report the incident via established reporting procedures<sup>5</sup>.

Step Four: Post Analysis<sup>6</sup>

At the Ports of Entry: CBP Officers will contact C4 and local CISEN Delegado for post-incident analysis and follow-up.

Between the Ports: CBP Border Patrol Agents will contact C4 and local CISEN Delegado for post-incident analysis and follow-up.

Step Five: Post Incident Investigation (If applicable)

Objective: Facilitate the flow of information among agencies and Foreign Governments, and preserve evidence based on existing protocols, statutory authorities of both countries, and responding agencies policies in order to enhance prosecutions on both sides of the border.

Contact the ICE Duty agent via SECTOR Communications "Charlie 100" and as per established DHS/CBP protocols for incidents at or between the Ports of Entry.

ICE will contact CISEN to coordinate the follow up investigation.

# Operational Protocols for Border Violence Incidents

## Border Violence Occurring in Mexico

### Step One: Incident Notification

At the Ports of Entry: The Mexican Customs and Immigration Officers will notify the Port of Entry Command center and the Border Patrol Station Dispatch Office regardless of the location or nature of the incident<sup>7</sup>. The Mexican Customs and Immigration Officers will provide a secondary notification to the CISEN Headquarters Command Center in Mexico City.

Between the Ports: The Mexican reporting agency will notify the Port of Entry Command center and the Border Patrol Station Dispatch Office regardless of the location or nature of the incident. The Mexican reporting agency will provide a secondary notification to the CISEN Headquarters Command Center in Mexico City.

### Step Two: Incident Response

At the Ports of Entry: CBP Port of Entry and Border Patrol will coordinate to deploy the Law Enforcement Agency that will provide the most efficient and effective response. Hand-held radios may be used after initial notifications to expedite USG Law Enforcement response.

Between the Ports: CBP Port of Entry and Border Patrol will coordinate to deploy the Law Enforcement Agency that will provide the most efficient and effective response. Hand-held radios may be used after initial notifications to expedite USG Law Enforcement response.

### Step Three: HQ Notification

At the Ports of Entry: CBP Officers will report the incident via established reporting procedures.

Between the Ports: CBP Border Patrol Agents will report the incident via established reporting procedures.

### Step Four: Post Analysis

At the Ports of Entry: CBP Officers will provide Mexican Customs and/or Immigration with any follow-up information. CBP Officers will also contact the local CISEN Delegado to update any actions taken by CBP Officers. Mexican Customs and/or Immigration will call CISEN Headquarters Command Center to verify and provide update on response.

Between the Ports: CBP Border Patrol Agents will provide the Mexican reporting agency with any follow-up information. CBP Border Patrol Agents will also contact local

CISEN Delegado to provide update on actions taken by CBP Border Patrol Agents. Mexican Customs and/or Immigration will call CISEN Headquarters Command Center to verify and provide update on response.

Step Five: Investigative Process (if applicable)

Objective: Facilitate the flow of information among agencies and Foreign Governments, and preserve evidence based on existing protocols, statutory authorities of both countries, and responding agencies policies in order to enhance prosecutions on both sides of the border.

Contact the ICE Duty agent via SECTOR Communications "Charlie 100" and as per established DHS/CBP protocols for incidents at or between the Ports of Entry.

ICE will contact CISEN to coordinate the follow up investigation.

## Communication Strategy:

The objective of the Operational Protocols for Border Violence Incidents is to establish a consistent method of cross border notification. In lieu of contacting individual persons, the responsible office or agency will be contacted to coordinate the proper response and deployment of resources.
