



Hazardous Weather

River Flood Status/5 Day Forecast Rainfall


- Rivers in Moderate to Major flood over the eastern ½ of TX will be slow to respond
 - The Brazos River near Richmond has dropped below major flood stage and is forecast to drop below flood stage by this weekend.
 - The Brazos River near Rosharon has crested but will remain in major flood stage through tomorrow and remain in moderate flood stage through this week.
 - The Trinity River at Liberty has crested but will remain in moderate flood stage through the week.
 - The Trinity River at Trinidad and Long Lake will remain in moderate flood stage through the week.




Disclaimer: Although this image shows the next 5 days of expected rainfall, river forecasts only incorporate 1-2 days worth of precipitation.

Hazardous Weather



Temperatures this afternoon will range from the upper 80s near the coast to mid 90s in the Upper Valley with isolated showers and thunderstorms. High pressure over the Northern Plains will bring in northeast winds and fairly pleasant weather across our area this afternoon.



Isolated showers and thunderstorms are expected this afternoon mainly along and southeast of Interstates 10 and 35, while the rest of South Central Texas should remain dry with mostly sunny skies. High temperatures will remain in the upper 80s to lower 90s a few degrees below normal. Winds will generally remain out of the northeast at 5-10 miles per hour except in the Rio Grande Plains where winds will be more out of the southeast.






