STATEWIDE CURRENT SITUATION: On Monday the front in south Texas will begin to move north as a warm front. This should push the chances of rain back into north Texas. However, heavy rain is not expected. The upper low near San Antonio is expected to shift back to the southwest into Mexico, which will keep rain chances high southwest of the Texas Big Bend area however not over Texas. By Tuesday, a high pressure system is forecast to build over southeast Texas and southern Louisiana which will suppress rainfall chances across the southeast half of the state. This ridge will dominate the weather through mid-week and drier weather will prevail.

For Monday into Tuesday morning rainfall amounts of 0.25 to 0.50 inch are forecast over portions of northern and western Texas.

Many highways and roadways were affected by the heavy rains yesterday. Water remains over roadways in low lying areas in the following counties: Atascosa, Coryell, Grimes, Karnes, Lee, Medina, Uvalde, Val Verde, Wilson and Zavala.



NOTE: Flash Flooding or Minor River Flooding will NOT be included in this outlook.

River Basins:

San Antonio Basin – Major Flooding: Widespread heavy rainfall in the San Antonio Basin resulted in moderate to significant rises on basin rivers and tributaries. No reports of impacts to residences or businesses.

Guadalupe Basin – Minor Flooding: Locally heavy rainfall occurred over the middle Guadalupe River Basin over the last 24 hours. This is causing minor rises on the mainstream of the Guadalupe River. No reports of impacts to residences or businesses.

Trinity Basin – Minor Flooding: Out of bank to minor flooding continues in the upper West Fork of the Trinity River. Additional rainfall is not forecast in the Trinity Basin for the next several days.

Rio Grande Basin – Minor Flooding: Heavy rainfall occurred a couple days ago near Del Rio. This is causing rises along the Rio Grande River downstream of Del Rio. Locations along the

Rio Grande River between Del Rio and Laredo are currently rising, or are expected to rise as the flood wave translates downstream along the Rio Grande system.

Brazos Basin – Minor Flooding: Recent rainfall is resulting in out of bank flows and some minor flooding in isolated locations across the Brazos River Basin. Additional significant rainfall is not forecast in the Brazos Basin for the next several days.

Region 3 (Includes DDCs 19, 20, 21, and 24)

DDC 24 – Del Rio (Includes: Val Verde, Edwards, Real, Kinney, Uvalde, Maverick, Zavala, Dimmit and La Salle Counties)

La Salle County: A water rescue on Farm-to-Market Road (FM) 77 at Sandies Creek occurred on Sunday; 08/21/16 after a van drove around barricades and was swept off the roadway. The occupant was rescued.

Region 6 (Includes DDCs 11/23, 12, 17, and 18)

DDC 18 – AARC/Bexar County (Includes: Atascosa, Bexar, Karnes, McMullen and Wilson Counties)

Wilson County: Wilson County opened a shelter at Floresville Middle School located at 2601 B Street in Floresville. The shelter was closed at 12:00PM on Sunday, 08/21/16.
