




Wind Speeds

Hazardous Weather



Rain chances and cool temperatures due to a weakening upper trough to our northwest and abundant moisture

Rain chances will continue today and tonight, with highest likelihood once again on the Caprock and favoring areas near the New Mexico border. Locally heavy rainfall will result in excess runoff and street flooding in a few areas. High temperatures today will again be from 5 to 10 degrees below normal.

Showers and thunderstorms could result in additional heavy rainfall of 1" with locally higher amounts possible. Some locations over southeast New Mexico and the northwest Permian Basin have already received 3-5" of rainfall in the last 24 hours, with many other locations receiving an inch or two in the last couple of days. Flash flooding will be possible today. If you encounter flooded roadways, Turn Around, Don't Drown!

Coastal Flood Advisory Midnight – 4PM Tuesday

Minor Tidal Overflow Likely Near High Tide

Impacts:



- Tide levels are running 1.2 to nearly 1.5 feet above predicted tide levels.
- High tide at Port Aransas at 4:16 AM Tuesday, with predicted level around 0.8 feet MSL.
- Forecast tides likely near or above 2 feet MSL near high tide.
- At 2 feet MSL, several beach access roads become flooded. Minor flooding area beaches. Water to dunes.
- Laguna Shores Drive and North Beach may be impacted


Issued at 9:11 PM - August 29, 2016

A Coastal Flood Advisory is in effect from Midnight through 4 PM Tuesday for the southern coastal counties. Tide levels are expected to rise to near or above 2 feet MSL around high tide overnight, possibly into Tuesday afternoon.



