



## Labor Day Weekend Forecast

Labor Day Weekend forecast calls for warming temperatures as we go from Saturday into Labor Day. Best chances of showers and thunderstorms will be across the western Panhandles to start the weekend with improving conditions expected throughout the weekend. High temperatures will range from the mid 80s to lower 90s by the time we get to Labor Day. Winds will be out of the south between 10- 20 MPH.



A few showers and storms will be possible Saturday but most areas will remain dry.

## Today's Forecast for Lubbock





A few isolated showers and thunderstorms during the day will give way to great weather this evening. Temperatures will be very pleasant with highs in the middle 80s and readings falling through the 70s this evening.



A bit of drying across the region, but still enough moisture lingering around to result in showers and thunderstorms again for Saturday. Areas west of the Rio Grande will see only isolated storms while areas to the east should see scattered storms. Temperatures will be seasonal, and skies will see lots of sun with developing afternoon clouds.

# Hazardous Weather



Thunderstorms are possible once again today through best chances will be near the mountain regions. Brief heavy rainfall will be possible with any storm. Highs will be in the 80s to lower 90s.




There is a slight chance of afternoon showers and thunderstorms across western North Texas and portions of Central Texas. Elsewhere, the humidity will be noticeably lower, but high temperatures may still reach 90 degrees. A warmer day will follow on Sunday. Thunderstorm chances will increase on Labor Day, with the bulk of the activity impacting Central and East Texas. The severe threat is low, but the stronger storms on Monday may produce strong winds. If engaged in outdoor activities, stay alert. Move indoors immediately if lightning is seen or thunder is heard.

- Grounds are already moist so rain may run off quicker and lead to flooding of low lying areas.







# Hazardous Weather



There is a chance for showers and thunderstorms over the Victoria area and Northeast Coastal Bend today, with lower chances farther south and west. High temperatures will be in the 90s away from the immediate coast, with winds becoming east and increasing to around 10 mph.




A stationary frontal boundary draped across the middle and upper Texas coast and an upper level trough of low pressure across the southwest Gulf of Mexico will provide isolated showers and thunderstorms across portions of the Rio Grande valley and the northern ranch lands today. Expect brief heavy rainfall with these showers and storms. Temperatures will range from the upper 80s along the lower Texas coast to the middle and upper 90s inland with a few locations near 100 degrees this afternoon.

There is a slight chance of showers and thunderstorms again this afternoon with the best chance over the southeastern counties.






