








WindSpd(Kts) & WindDir For Tue Sep 06 2016 5PM EDT







Hazardous Weather



Moisture will be on the increase across the region today as Hurricane Newton moves north through the Gulf of California. The best storm chances this afternoon and evening will reside across the southwest Texas Panhandle and western portions of the South Plains. Chances will be lower farther to the east. Some locally heavy rain is possible near the state line.



Rain chances increase today with slightly below normal temperatures.



Fire Activity (*Last 24 Hours)

Reports 525 (no change) fires and 110,838 (no change) acres destroyed this year. There are 63 (-1) counties with burn bans. The Keetch-Byram Drought Index list 85 (+3) counties with an average over 400.
