

Wind Speeds





Severe Weather Outlook Friday, September 09, 2016



Friday Night Lights?

- Storm chances increase by sunset.
- Greatest coverage of storms expected around midnight.
- Some heavy rain possible, mainly east of Lubbock.



Issued: 443 AM CDT Fri Sep 9 2016

A strong cold front will usher in big changes beginning tonight in the form of storms and 20-25 mph northeast winds after midnight.



Thunderstorms are expected again today and tonight, mainly over the Davis and Apache Mountains southward this afternoon, and then over the Western Low Rolling Plains tonight as a cold front approaches. Stronger storms will be accompanied by frequent lightning, locally heavy rainfall resulting in flooding of low-lying areas, and wind gusts to 55 mph. Otherwise, above-normal temperatures!

Hazardous Weather

Chance for showers and thunderstorms Friday Night through Saturday

A cold front should reach I20 by 7 AM Saturday, San Angelo to Brownwood by 10 AM, and Interstate 10 around Noon.

Scattered showers and thunderstorms are expected, mainly after midnight north of I-20, then spreading south through the rest of the area Saturday. Rainfall amounts will range from 0.10 to 0.50. Watch out for dangerous lightning strikes, gusty winds, and locally heavy rainfall.



A cold front will produce showers and thunderstorms around Haskell and Throckmorton after midnight Friday night. Showers and thunderstorms will continue to develop across the rest of the area during the day on Saturday. Cooler temperatures can also be expected behind the front.







Reports 526 (no change) fires and 110,838 (no change) acres destroyed this year. There are 60 (no change) counties with burn bans. The Keetch-Byram Drought Index list 103 (+4) counties with an average over 400.
