
Saturday – Wednesday

Tropical Weather Outlook




Area 1...A broad area of low pressure 1000 miles east of the Lesser Antilles may become a tropical depression by early next week.
Formation chance through 48 hours...high...near 70%
Formation chance through 5 days...high...90%

Area 2...An area of showers and thunderstorms north of Puerto Rico is unorganized and development is unlikely.
Formation chance through 48 hours...low...near 10%
Formation chance through 5 days...high...10%


Area 3...A weak low pressure system over the extreme southeast Gulf of Mexico is unlikely to develop as it moves westward.
Formation chance through 48 hours...low...near 10%
Formation chance through 5 days...high...10%

Minor river flooding will continue over some areas in SW LA through the weekend but will drop below flood stage by Monday.




