






Severe Weather Outlook Tuesday, November 29, 2016

Strong to Severe Thunderstorms will become very likely today as an upper level storm system moves into our region from the west. Damaging Wind Gusts...Isolated Tornadoes, Large Hail and moderate to heavy rainfall will all be possible before these storms exit our region this evening.




Areas of dense fog will continue across central portions of the area...with improving visibilities along the coast. Scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms will be possible across the northern counties.







Fire Activity (*Last 24 Hours)

Reports 700 (+3) fires and 115,116 (+21) acres destroyed this year. There are 61 (no change) counties with burn bans. The Keetch-Byram Drought Index list 91 (-2) counties with an average over 400.
