Today


- No significant impacts expected

Friday - Monday

- Snow possible over NM and the TX/OK Panhandles on Friday night into Saturday morning; no significant impacts expected at this time due to relatively little accumulations
- Rain, possibly heavy at times, is expected to develop over Coastal TX and Coastal SW LA Friday night into Saturday morning
- More widespread rainfall is expected across SE & E TX, into LA and far S AR on Saturday and Sunday, and even into Monday
 - While widespread flooding is not expected, a few rivers may rise into minor flood stage over these areas and there may be some localized flooding

5-Day Precipitation Forecast & River Flood Status

There is currently no significant river flooding observed across the Region.


Tomorrow's Weather




Some light snow is possible across NM and the TX/OK Panhandles tomorrow night. No significant impacts expected at this time with relatively little accumulations.





Some light snow could linger near the TX/OK Panhandles early. No significant impacts expected at this time with relatively little accumulations.

Heavy rain/isolated flooding possible over SE and E TX into N LA and S AR.


A few strong storms possible over SE TX.

Heavy rain looks to continue into Monday before moving out of the Region early Tuesday





