




Severe Weather Outlook Wednesday, December 07, 2016

Hazardous Weather



Above-normal temperatures today, but a strong arctic cold front will move through West Texas and Southeast New Mexico overnight, ruining the nice weather. A wintry mix of precipitation is anticipated, resulting in hazardous driving conditions.

Light Wintry Mix of Precipitation Possible

Late Tonight & Thursday Morning


Light Wintry Precipitation possible across blue shaded area.

Light rain, light freezing rain, light snow and sleet possible.

Patchy minor accumulation of snow possible Thursday morning (less than half an inch), mainly on grassy surfaces.

Isolated slick spots may develop on a few bridges & overpasses. Otherwise, no other travel impacts are expected.

Light wintry precipitation will be possible beginning late tonight and continuing Thursday morning, across the blue shaded area. With the warm ground temperatures and with precipitation expected to be light, only minor accumulation, if any, is expected. Stay tuned for the latest updates and forecasts.


Hazardous Weather



The first chance for winter precipitation of the season will arrive across the southwest portions of the region overnight Wednesday through Thursday morning. Initially cold light rain may transition into light freezing rain as surface temperatures fall below freezing during the predawn hours. The light freezing rain may mix with sleet after sunrise Thursday. Only very light accumulations of freezing rain and sleet are expected, mainly on elevated surfaces. However, some travel impacts are still possible. All precipitation will end Thursday afternoon.

Fire Danger Forecast


Forecast Fire Danger





Reports 707 (no change) fires and 115,253 (no change) acres destroyed this year. There are 54 (-1) counties with burn bans. The Keetch-Byram Drought Index list 16 (+2) counties with an average over 400.
