
Icy Conditions Possible Friday/Saturday

- Cold air will arrive late Thursday as a storm system begins to approach from the west.
- Precipitation will initially be light as it spreads across the area early Friday.
- The combination of below freezing temperatures and falling rain will create icy conditions from the Panhandle into the northern South Plains and Rolling Plains Saturday morning.
- Trees, powerlines and elevated surfaces will be affected.




A storm system will move across West Texas this weekend bringing a variety of weather, from thunderstorms in the south to a possible ice storm in the north. Precipitation will develop and expand across the area late Friday and Saturday, with the heaviest and most widespread precipitation expected Saturday night and Sunday morning.

Fire Danger Forecast




Burn Bans and KBDI INDEX
