**STATEWIDE CURRENT SITUATION:** Governor Abbot issued a disaster proclamation stating that the severe weather and flooding event that began on 0619/18, has caused a disaster in Aransas, Cameron, Hidalgo, Nueces, San Patricio and Willacy Counties. Flood water continues to recede and impacted local jurisdictions are beginning to assess damage as access to flooded areas occurs. Preliminary damage assessments are being coordinated as areas become accessible.

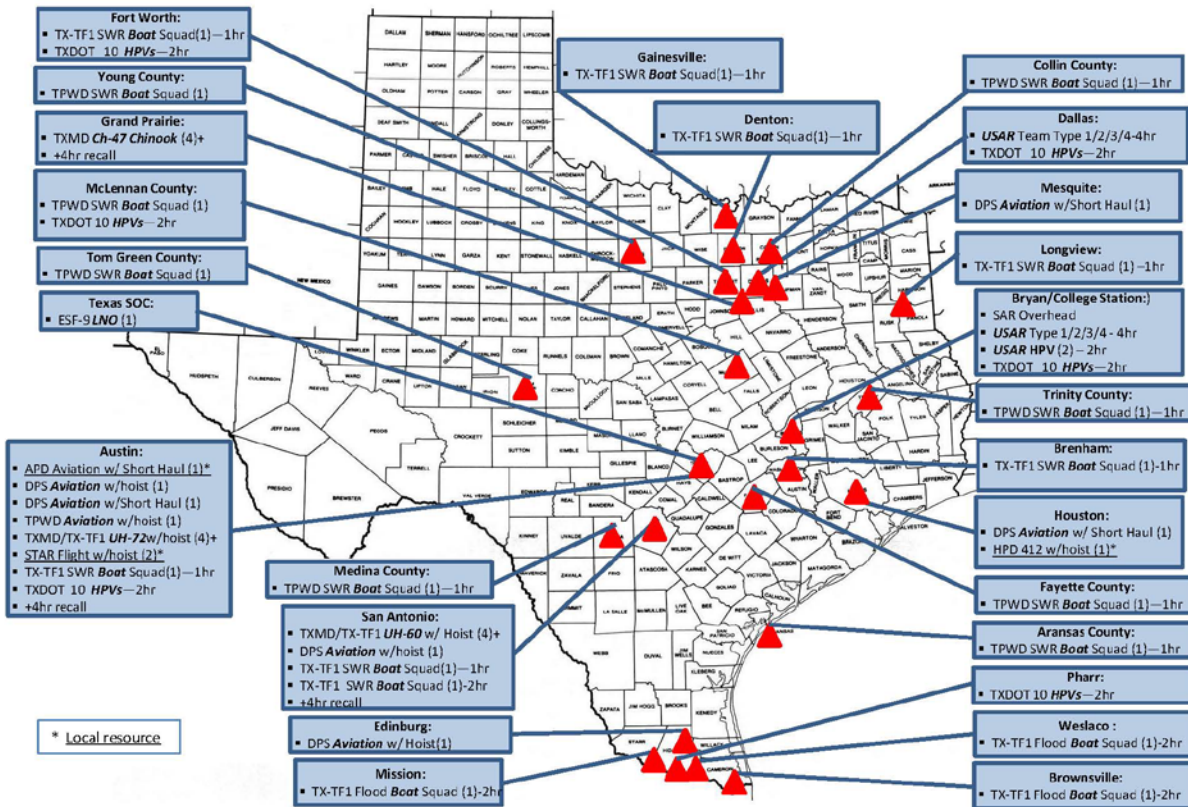

**Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT):** TxDOT is reporting 39 flooded roadways, 15 closed roadways, and 24 flooded but passable roadways throughout the Coast Bend Region. For the most current information on Texas road conditions, go to [www.Drivetexas.org](http://www.Drivetexas.org).

**Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM):** Field Response continues to work with local, state, and federal agencies, as well as volunteer partners in the continuing response and recovery efforts throughout the impacted jurisdictions.

**State Operations Center (SOC):** A total of 36 State of Texas Assistance Requests (STARs) and 65 actions have been processed for June Severe Weather Incident.

**Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ):** Regional staff continues to conduct assessments of drinking water and wastewater facilities in impacted areas to determine operational status and address any significant incidents. [Thirty-six drinking water systems were impacted with all reporting no issues. Forty wastewater systems were impacted with 35 reporting no significant issues.](#)

**Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD):** [TPWD continues to maintain two airboats on standby at the National Guard Armory with local game wardens available for calls for service.](#)

**Texas Military Department (TMD):** TMD has a total of [five](#) personnel mobilized.

**American Red Cross (ARC):** Continues to support shelter operations in the impacted areas.

**The Salvation Army (TSA):** TSA Liaison has deployed to the Corpus Christi EOC. Emergency shelter stood up in McAllen / Hidalgo County. On standby to support with Mass Care services as needed. The Salvation Army is supporting two Red Cross Shelters with food and hydration; one in Donna and one in Weslaco, providing 600 meals. The Salvation Army of McAllen is partnering with Catholic Charities providing clothing and other relief items to those affected. Local volunteers are on stand-by to respond as needed.

**Texas Animal Health Commission (TAHC):** Regional personnel are in contact with local EOCs/DDCs to assist. All TAHC field personnel in affected regions are assigned or placed on standby to respond to local requests.

**Texas A&M Forest Service (TFS):** One TFS representative is activated to the SOC. The Texas Intrastate Fire Mutual Aid System (TIFMAS) has provided fire trucks and firefighters to support state emergency response operations currently with two Task Forces, including three Engines, one Truck and one Chief Officer.

Three incident management team (IMT) members are supporting DDC-21 and are located in Weslaco, TX.

**FINAL COMMENTS:** The State of Texas State Operations Center (SOC) increased the readiness level to Level III (Increased Readiness Conditions) as of 10:00 AM on June 19, 2018. The Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM) continues to monitor the situation and will provide additional situation reports as needed.

**The four levels of SOC activation are:**

- Level I (Emergency Conditions)
- Level II (Escalated Response Conditions)
- Level III (Increased Readiness Conditions)
- Level IV (Normal Conditions)
