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## DPS ANNOUNCES VENDOR FOR TLETS RE-ENGINEERING

The TLETS Re-Engineering project team is pleased to announce that the Texas Department of Public Safety awarded a contract to Datamaxx Applied Technologies, Inc. (Datamaxx) in April 2004. Project kick-off began on May 3, 2004. The new system will replace the TLETS message switch, provide a browser-based user interface, and supply TxDPS with an online Training and Certification system.

The message switch software is the OpenFox™ Message Switch from Computer Projects of Illinois (CPI). CPI will customize the OpenFox™ to meet the needs of TxDPS. CPI has installed state level law enforcement message switches in more than 20 states across the nation. The OpenFox™ is a robust message switch that runs on an IBM pSeries under AIX.

Datamaxx will provide a browser-based user interface that will replace the 3270 "green screens" currently used by the TLETS end user. The new user interface is a web-based application called Omnixx Force Browser. The TLETS end user will be provided a copy of the client application which will be invoked from a standard web browser such as Internet Explorer or Netscape Navigator. The interface will provide the user with enhanced features such as more field edits, improved online "help", more options for processing received messages, etc.

The Training and Certification system is a web-based application that is used in several states and will be customized to meet the needs of TxDPS. The Training and Certification system is not intended to fully replace the classroom training currently provided by TxDPS. It will provide all users the ability to re-certify on-line and give agencies and their employees the opportunity to take on-line courses with exercises, check on their certification status, enroll in instructor led courses, etc.

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The Omnixx client applications will operate on the entire following platform although variances in certain aspects of Windows' appearance exist:

- Microsoft® Windows 98 (1st or 2nd edition),
- NT 4.0 with Service Pack 5,
- ME, 2000 Professional,
- 2000 Server,
- 2000 Advanced Server,
- XP operating systems running on Intel hardware.

Users will also need the following products (readily available in the marketplace at no charge to the end-user) to operate the software:

- Internet Explorer version 5.5 SP2 and above,
- Netscape version 4.7x, 6.2x and above,
- Java Run Time Environment.

TxDPS will no longer be offering SNA as an alternative for communicating with TLETS. Current interface agencies will be required to make modifications to their systems in order to communicate with the OpenFox™ message switch. The following changes are known at this time:

- replace the communications in their server application with support for DMPP-2020 TCP/IP socket protocol.
- provide 256-bit Rijndael (AES) encryption.
- modify the TLETS header upon migration to the new system.

Interface systems will also have the option to use XML using the OpenFox Markup Language (OFML™) standards. OFML™ is an extension of XML for law enforcement interfaces. It defines an XML-based method for exchanging law enforcement information. It does not specify the format of the law enforcement information itself, only the structure for its exchange. TxDPS will schedule one or more conferences for the interface agencies and provide documentation during the fall of 2004. Datamaxx/CPI personnel will be on hand at the conference to assist with questions regarding the migration from LU 6.2 to the DMPP-2020®<sup>1</sup> TCP/IP application protocol.

TxDPS anticipates that the new system will be in production in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter of 2005. The current system will be modified to communicate with the new system so that users will be allowed to migrate to the new system gradually, over time. TxDPS will make every effort to not impose undue hardship on our member agencies; however, users will be required to migrate to the new system no later than September 2008.

TxDPS is very excited about the new system. The system will provide some much needed enhancements that:

- facilitate the offline search process.
- provide the functionality of NCIC 2000, including images.
- increase system security.

Testing will begin at TxDPS headquarters as soon as possible. Agencies and their vendors may volunteer to participate in the early migration to the new system by contacting the TLETS Order Center at [tlets\\_order\\_center@txdps.state.tx.us](mailto:tlets_order_center@txdps.state.tx.us). TxDPS cannot guarantee that a volunteer will be selected to participate in the early migration. Selection will be dependent on many factors.

## OFFICERS FLYING ARMED

### Attention TLETS Operators

The Transportation Security Administration and NLETS have an effort to further enhance the security measures in place at airports nationwide. TSA will be instituting a pilot project designed to strengthen the ability of the TSA staff to verify the identity of individuals who arrive at the TSA screening checkpoint and identify themselves as law enforcement officer (LEO authorized to fly with their firearm.) This pilot project begins on April 15 and continues through July 15. During the pilot, TSA is requesting that all Federal, State and Local Law Enforcement officers traveling via commercial aircraft while armed provide advance notification to TSA via the National Law Enforcement Telecommunications System (NLETS.) TSA is requesting that the LEO or their office send an administrative message via NLETS, containing the traveling LEO'S name, flight information and mission need to fly armed. TSA's originating agency identifier (ORI) is **"VATSA1200."**

TSA WILL GENERATE AN IMMEDIATE CONFIRMATION MESSAGE TO THE LEO. The LEO should bring this confirmation message in addition to the following items: badge/credentials, a second form of government identification and the air carrier's notice of LEO flying armed from the TSA screening checkpoint. State and local LEO'S are still required to present a letter from their agency authorizing them to fly armed. Participation is voluntary. LEO'S authorized to fly armed who present themselves at the screening checkpoint without a TSA confirmation message will be permitted to fly armed after TSA or local police personnel review their identification and required forms. Once cleared the LEO will enter their information in the logbook maintained at the checkpoint and proceed into the sterile area. If you have questions contact TSA'S Timothy Murray at 571.227.1560, between 10:00 and 17:00 EST. After hours for immediate/urgent attention call the TSA coordination center 703.563.3234. At the end of this 90-day pilot, participants and NLETS will be asked to comment on what did or did not work well with the pilot. These messages will use the "AM message key to the TSA specific ORI.

### DPS WARRANT DATABANK TERMINATED

As of March 26 the DPS Warrant Databank was terminated, you will no longer see caveats on DL returns stating: DPS WARRANT (DPS CITY NAME), There is an alternative program way for handling violators who fail to appear in justice or municipal court is a program established by the legislature and set out in the Transportation code CH. 706. The Failure to Appear Program (FTA) covers all offenses with the jurisdiction of municipal and justice courts. The "HP" warrant confirmation format has been removed from the TLETS production.

### **Tool for Law Enforcement The \$.M Message and Dental History**

The NCIC dental codes have changed in the missing persons and unidentified persons transactions. Now agencies are able to enter dental codes in wanted person file records. The dental algorithm is shared between the missing person, unidentified person and wanted person files. Existing dental information was automatically modified April 4, 2004 upon implementation of enhancements. The revised dental codes are set forth in the NCIC TOU 03-1 and 04-1. When a \$.M is received, be sure to run both NIC numbers reflected to verify the status of the record entries. Then, make contact with the other entering agency (ORI) for further assessment of the possible match.

# Planning roof repairs?

During the better weather that comes with the change of seasons, many agencies contemplate roof work. If your agency has something scheduled and you are connected to the TLETS network through a satellite connection (you will have a Personal Earth Station (PES) from Hughes Network Systems (HNS) if you are), you will need to coordinate the dates with the TLETS Order Center at 512-424-2256 as soon as you have a date the work will be done. This will allow the Order Center to make arrangements with our installation contractor to have personnel available in case your roofing contractor does not return the satellite dish to the optimum place for uninterrupted connectivity to the TLETS network or at least minimize the outage. ## HANDGUN UPDATE

Effective March 2004, Texas has made a reciprocal agreement with North Carolina that allows concealed handgun license holders from that state to legally carry in Texas. North Carolina license holders will be required to follow Texas law while carrying in this state. At the options menu screen type in: HANDGUN and press the F1 key. The following states have reciprocity agreements with Texas: Arizona, Arkansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Oklahoma, Tennessee, Wyoming and North Carolina.



## ASK TXDOT

Q. In the remarks field of a vehicle registration the text states: Legal restraint-contact TXDOT, what does this mean?

A. A legal restraint remark usually has to do with ownership disputes or errors on titles for vehicles. The remark is either put on the record by court order and starts with "OP" or if the # starts with "OR," then the vehicle has been wrecked, and the owner retained the vehicle after the insurance company paid off. A CR remark means the title was issued incorrectly (lien left off, second owner left off, name misspelled, etc.) Sometimes, the remark will start with a number + a PTC suffix. The number is a TXDOT district office number, and the district's Public Transportation Coordinator of the appropriate district must be contacted before the vehicle may be titled or registered. In most instances, when looking up the legal restraint number, our internal record has the information as to whether the vehicle can be registered and/or titled. Some cases the vehicle is part of a group of vehicles involved in a lawsuit against a dealership, the attorney's phone number is listed in our record, and this attorney must be contacted. A legal restraint remark is against the vehicle, not the person driving the vehicle. Contact TXDOT Vehicle Records & Titles at: 512.465.7611

Q. What does the "IRP" stand for on the top line of a vehicle registration and what is the meaning of "Apportioned Account 049760"?

A. Example response: such as (2003 IRP Plate), stands for "International Registration Plan" which is given to vehicles who drive internationally, like into Mexico, United States, Canada, etc. Apportioned Accounts number: A person can own a truck and "hire" out to a company, who in turn, pays all the fees. An apportioned account is for vehicles that travel through several states. Each state has its own regulatory fees; therefore, the trucker pays only those fees for the number of miles he travels in that state. Each truck "base states" usually in their state of residence. For example, a truck base stated in Texas would receive a bill for number of miles traveled throughout the US or Canada (if apportioned all the way there). Texas would collect all the fees for all applicable states, and proportionally distribute to other states based on what their rate per mile was. Therefore, the trucker must keep accurate mileage records on each vehicle (highway numbers traveled, odometer readings, etc.). The "cab card," which must be carried in the vehicle at all times,

lists all states in which the vehicle is apportioned. Of course, they must be on a contiguous line (can't be apportioned in Texas and Arizona, without having New Mexico on the cab card). **NOTE: When you run the vehicle by "plate" it may not be the owner of the vehicle. Running by plate may state: ISSUED TO: (Not owner). It is advisable to also run the vehicle by "license plate and vehicle identification number "VIN" to find the correct owner of the vehicle..** Visit TXDOT's web page for further information concerning IRP Accounts and other information at:

## National Crime Information Center (NCIC) Hot Check Initiative

A large number of fingerprint contributors assumed that their submissions were searched against the Integrated Automated Fingerprint Identification System (IAFIS) and the NCIC. Under the old process, however, automated checks searched against the NCIC were not being conducted for the IAFIS ten-print submissions. The FBI CJIS Division recognizes that the need for comprehensive criminal information, which is increasing, will become even more critical when individuals begin submitting fingerprint images to IAFIS as required by legislative mandates involving homeland security. To help meet that need, the CJIS Division has undertaken a new initiative to link IAFIS automated ten-print searches to specific NCIC files. Called the **Hot Check Initiative**, the new procedure will be implemented in two phases.

In **Phase I** of the initiative, which became operational on September 14, 2003, the FBI will process IAFIS criminal and civil ten-print submissions in the following manner:

- For each IAFIS ten-print criminal and civil submission, the Interstate Identification Index segment of IAFIS will send one inquiry request to NCIC using a new NCIC message.
- NCIC will query the Wanted Person File and the Violent Gang and Terrorist Organization File (VGTOF). The NCIC will generate a query using the name, date of birth (DOB), sex, and race from the fingerprint submission. Additional search elements will include the FBI number and up to ten aliases, five additional DOBs, four miscellaneous numbers, and four social security numbers if provided on the ten-print submission. The DOB included in the inquiry message must match the date of birth on the NCIC record for the NCIC to return a record as a possible match. CJIS Division personnel will also include additional filtering logic to help reduce the volume of NCIC hits returned as possible matches.
- After the search is completed, NCIC will generate a notification of the Hot Check inquiry for all hits. This notification will be sent to the owners of the NCIC record as a National Law Enforcement Telecommunication System, Inc. (NLETS) Administrative Message. The NLETS message will include pertinent information from the fingerprint record, as well as the NCIC record.

The NCIC record holder will contact the fingerprint contributor whenever necessary.

### Phase II:

Phase II of the Hot Check Initiative is currently in the research stage. Details regarding implementation of Phase II will be forthcoming.

### III Interstate Identification Index Records Update

TxDPS has recently reviewed the processing of Identification Index Record (III) messages by NCIC and has determined that a change is necessary. This change may affect internal routing of CR responses from NLETS at agencies with interface (CAD and RMS) systems. **TxDPS recommends that you pass this information along to technical staff and/or your interface system vendor for review.**

Currently, when a QR (NCIC Interstate Identification Index Record Request) is submitted to NCIC and a full record exists in another state, NCIC sends characters 5-14 from the TCIC header to the holding state. The holding state returns those characters in the NLETS control field of the CR response to TLETS. Most often, the interface agency uses the NLETS control field in the CR response to route the message internally to the requesting device. The impact that this change will have on the interface agency is dependent on the how the interface system has been designed.

Effective August 3, 2004 NCIC will be sending characters 10-19 from the TCIC header to the holding state. This means that characters 10-19 of the original TCIC header will be returned in the CR response instead of characters 5-14. This change will provide the interface agency with more flexibility in the use of the control field. The interface agency can make the control field in the CR response like the control field in other NLETS messages.

Interface agencies should be cognizant of this change, determine the impact to their interface systems, and, where applicable, prepare to change their systems to route the CR responses internally in the newer format. Questions and concerns may be relayed to any of the following individuals:




