## **Amarillo man added to Texas Top 10 Most Wanted list; \$5,000 reward offered**

A 38-year-old Amarillo man, who goes by the nickname “Tiney,” has been added to the Texas Top 10 Most Wanted list, and a \$5,000 cash reward is being offered for information leading to his arrest.

Timothy Esteban Tinner is wanted by the Potter County Sheriff’s Office for assault causing bodily injury relating to an attack on July 24, 2010, when he beat a woman and doused her with bleach. During the attack, Tinner threatened to set the victim on fire.

Tinner, who is 5 feet 4 inches tall, is a suspected CRIPS gang member and often carries a weapon. Anyone encountering him should exercise extreme caution. He has been arrested more than 20 times on charges ranging from DWI, possession of a controlled substance, evading arrest, deadly conduct with a weapon, aggravated assault with a deadly weapon and possession of a firearm by a felon.

Tinner has a tattoo on his upper left arm that says “Tiney” and one that says “Triston” on his back. To find out more about Tinner, please see his DPS Most Wanted poster:
