In October, 2000, the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) released the first <u>Traffic Stop Data Report</u> relating to Traffic Law Enforcement traffic stops. The report was designed to provide a historical background pertaining to the issues of racial profiling and examined the activities of the Texas Department of Public Safety as related to traffic stops.

In an on-going effort to keep the state's leadership, DPS commissioned officers, and other interested citizens of the state of Texas informed on department activities, a <u>Traffic Stop Data Report supplement</u> is issued each six months of the year to

end in June and December.

This report reflects cumulative traffic stop activities January through December of 2001.

The ethnic breakdown of the Texas population in this report is based on the 2000 United States Census Data, rather than the population estimates from the Texas State Data Center reflected in the initial report of October 2000.

The Texas Department of Public Safety remains committed to the prevention of racial profiling. Racial profiling is illegal, inconsistent with the principles of American policing, and an indefensible public protection strategy.

Based upon available data (January 1, 2001 - December 31, 2001) Troopers with the DPS made traffic stops, issued citations, warnings, and/or conducted searches of vehicles as follows:
















From January 1, 2001 - December 31, 2001, a total of 65,916 vehicles were searched during traffic stops. 54% of the searches were conducted on white drivers, 13% of the searches were conducted on black drivers and 31% of the searches were on Hispanic drivers.

From January 1, 2001 - December 31, 2001, 1,535 drug traffickers (above a user quanity of drugs) were discovered during vehicle searches. As a result of these arrests the agency confiscated 65,975 pounds of marijuana, 1,350,880 grams of cocaine, 45,820 grams of methamphetamine, 13,091 grams of heroin and 56,784 grams of other drugs. These confiscated drugs have an estimated street value of \$179,271,594.00

#### Highlights:

- \*75.60% of the total searches resulted in a non-traffic criminal arrest of the driver
- \*22.22% of the total searches resulted in a drug charge on the driver
- \*3.61% of the total searches resulted in a drug charge on black drivers
- \*11.46% of the total searches resulted in a non-traffic criminal arrest of black drivers
- \*24.40% of the total searches resulted in no non-traffic criminal activity
- \*3.88% of the total searches resulted in a drug charge on Hispanic drivers
- \*14.52% of the total searches resulted in a non-traffic criminal arrest of the Hispanic driver
- \*14.56% of the total searches resulted in a drug charge on white drivers
- \*49.02% of the total searches resulted in a non-traffic criminal arrest of white drivers
- \*Approximately 1 driver was arrested for a non-traffic criminal offense for every 3 vehicles that were searched

A non-traffic criminal offense is a criminal offense that is not classified as a traffic offense. These criminal offenses include violations that may range from minor in possession of an alcohlic beverage to murder. A vehicle search generally occurs when there is articulable reasonable suspicion or probable cause to believe there is further criminal activity.
