





CJD oversees the distribution of discretionary funds from the state's allocation of Justice Assistance Grants (JAG) to eligible agencies.


One of the possible qualifications for funding eligibility is participation in the UCR program.

To qualify as a UCR reporter, agencies must have sent the UCR program data, including zero reports, for each month for the year in question.


### What steps can be taken to remain grant eligible? 1. Each local law enforcement agency (LEA) should ensure timely and accurate reporting to the UCR program. Reports are to be submitted by the 10th of the month. You should have a designated person to submit reports and a backup for that person. 2. LEAs should communicate with the state UCR program any time they experience technical issues that may affect their NIBRS submissions. 3. City and County officials should be aware of grant funding requirements and have monitoring in place to ensure






## NIBRS VERBIAGE Unfounded An agency will receive a complaint that is determined through investigation to be false or baseless. In other words, no crime occurred. If the investigation shows no offense occurred nor was attempted, then the offense is deemed unfounded. The recovery of stolen property, the low value of the stolen property, the refusal of the victim to cooperate with the prosecution, or the fail ure to make an arrest does not unfound a legitimate offense. Also, the findings of a coroner, court, jury, or prosecutor do not unfound offenses or attempts that law enforcement investigations establish to be legitimate.

### **NIBRS CLEARANCE**

- In NIBRS, you clear incidents rather than individual offenses.
- Incidents may be cleared only by arrest or exceptional means.
- You cannot clear an incident by exceptional means if it was already cleared by an arrest.
- There will not be clearance for Justifiable Homicide
- LEAs must not confuse clearing an incident with administratively closing an investigation or changing the case status.

### **NIBRS CLEARANCE**

### **Cleared Exceptionally**

- The LEA investigation must have clearly and definitely established the identity of at least one offender.
- 2. The LEA must have sufficient probable cause to support arresting, charging, and prosecuting the offender.
- 3. The LEA must know the exact location of the offender so they could make an arrest if circumstances did not prevent it.
- There must be a reason outside the control of the LEA preventing the argest, charging, and turning over for prosecution. (i.e., A through E).

### **Cleared Exceptionally Reasons**

- A = Death of Offender
- B = Prosecution Declined (by the prosecutor for other than lack
- C = In Custody of Other Jurisdiction (includes extradition denied)
- D = Victim Refused to Cooperate (in the prosecution only)
- E = Juvenile/No Custody (the handling of a juvenile without taking him/her into custody, but rather by oral or written notice given to the parents or legal guardian in a case involving a minor offense, such as petty larceny)
- N = Not Applicable (not cleared exceptionally)

### **Disposition of Arrestee Under 18**

The word arrest as it applies to juveniles (17 years of age or younger at time of arrest) is intended to mean the law enforcement handling of those juveniles who have committed a crime and are taken into custody under such circumstances that, if the juvenile were an adult, an arrest would have been reported.

LEAs should report any situation where they handle/process a young person for a violation of the law.

H = Handled Within Department (released to parents, released with warning, principal, counselor, etc.)

R = Referred to Other Authorities (turned over to juvenile court, probation department, welfare agency, other police agency, criminal or adult court, etc.)

### **NIBRS Quality Control Issue NIBRS UNKNOWN OFFENDER**

There are two different kinds of unknown offenders in NIBRS reporting:

when the victim or agency doesn't know if one or multiple offenders committed the offense (i.e., Burglary of a house). Offender demographics and relationships are not required and must be left blank.

Known Unknown offender - 01
When the number of offenders (s) who committed the offense(s) are known but the age, sex, race, and ethnicity are unknown.

The offender would be assigned a sequence number from 01 to 99. Age would be 00 = unknown

















## BUT WHAT ABOUT ERRORS AND WARNINGS? It is the responsibility of the submitting agency to review the errors and warnings received with each flat file upload and make the necessary corrections. (to be included in the next submission) You receive an <a href="Error Report">Error Report</a> for every file uploaded. It tells you which incidents need corrections. Incidents with warnings need to be reviewed. Valid incidents (with warnings only) are uploaded to the repository and forwarded to the FBI for review. Keep in mind incidents with errors will not be uploaded into the repository, they will not get counted in your agency's crime statistics and will not be forwarded to the FBI for publications.








































Cargo Theft Myth - The stealing of mail from a postal truck, a package from a porch, food from a restaurant driver or food delivery service is cargo theft.

At this point, the items (mail, household good, meal) are no longer commercial ship ments because they are not in the supply chain.

The 2023 NIBRS User Manual pg. 72 states:
"LEAs should consider thefts of goods being delivered to a business from United Parcel Service (UPS), Federal Express (FedEx), the U.S. Postal Service, etc., to be cargo until the items arrive at the business, or final distribution point.

Grocery orders, Food delivery, stealing packages from mailboxes is not cargo theft.
