Course Descriptions:

<u>Crimes Against Society</u> – This class aims to provide participants with a deeper understanding of Crimes Against Society, whose victims are always Society, as well as the mandatory data elements required when reporting these offenses.

<u>Group B Offenses</u> - This class highlights the seven NIBRS Group B Offenses that are not Group A offenses for Texas UCR reporting agencies. Students will learn which offenses are no longer reportable, when to report Group B Offenses, and be provided with examples of various Group B Offenses.

<u>Hate Crime Data Collection Guidelines</u> – This course will assist Law Enforcement agencies in identifying the types of bias crimes to be reported, recognizing a hate crime, and providing guidelines for reporting a hate crime.

Molly Jane's Law and ViCAP – This presentation will help you understand the basics of House Bill 3106, Molly Jane's Law, and the Texas requirements for law enforcement agencies on reporting incidents that apply to Molly Jane's Law.

<u>NIBRS Overview for ISD PDs</u> – The goal of this course is for participants to gain a greater understanding of the basics of NIBRS, which are applicable to ISD Police, and include juvenile clearances, common NIBRS offenses, sexual assault reporting, school-related scenarios, common ISD errors and warnings, along with where to locate NIBRS Technical Documentation for assistance. (ISD PDs or SROs only)
