



- ✓ Available 365/24/7 from any secure internet-capable device.
- ✓ Data covers the entire life cycle, from initial contact to release from prison.



✓ No fee service.



System Use Notification

The Federal Bureau of Investigation's (FBI) National Data Exchange (N-DEx) contains criminal justice information obtained by criminal justice agencies in connection with their official duties administering criminal justice. N-Dftx system access is restricted to criminal justice agencies and agencies performing the administration of orimnal justice. Personnel engaged in the following activities may be granted access to N-Db consistent with state laws. Law enforcement investigations, Pre-trial release investigation, Drake investigation, Criminal justice employment. background checks, Data administration/management, and Training*

*Training is considered to be an acceptable use of N-OEx, so long as it does not include curiosity searches, browsing, or self-queries. For example, celebrities, neighbors, friends, family members or associates.

N-DEx system usage is monitored, recorded, and subject to audit. The FBI Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Division conducts compliance audits. including review of user access and N-DEx transactions, in addition to maintaining an audit trail of each disclosure and receipt of N-DEx data. Therefore, all N-DEx searches must provide a Use Code and search reason identifying why the search was performed. It is recommended unique information, e.g., incident number, arrest transaction number, booking number, project name, description, etc., be entered to assist the user in accounting for appropriate system use for each transaction. The following Use Codes are considered acceptable when searching N-DEx:

Administrative Use Code "A": Must be used when N-OEx is utilized by a record-owning agency to retrieve and display N-OEx contributed records in association with performing the agency's data administration/management duty. Responses for this purpose shall not be disseminated for any other reason and are limited

User Confirmation

As a user accessing criminal justice information via N-DEx:

You must prior to reliance or action upon, obtain terms of use and verify the N-DEx information with the record-owning

N-DEx Example: Advanced Permission and Verification Requirement
A detective of the Springfield Police Department queried the N-DEx system, which produced a result containing information perfinent to the department's on-going investigation. The detective contacted the record-owning agency to discuss utilizing the information in the department's investigation, verify the relevancy of the information and request any other information the record-owner deemed applicable. The detective then utilized the information as authorized by the record-owning agency.

You consent to having your system usage monitored, recorded, and subject to audit

A state CJIS Systems Officer (CSO) contacted a local police department regarding potentially inappropriate use of the N-DEx system using the local department's Originating Agency Indicator (ORI). The state CSD identified the potentially inappropriate use by processing an audit report within the N-Obs system, which identified the user, agency, identity provider, search request, search rescon and use code. The state CSD partnered with the local police department and reviewed their findings with the agency and their users. The discussion resulted in the CSD's suspicion being confirmed and the user's actions were corrected.

You must adhere to the CJIS Security Policy, CJIS User Agreement, N-DEx Policy and Operating Manual, any applicable leveraged CJIS System of Services operating procedures or policies, and any applicable CJIS Systems Agency requirements.

N-DEx Example: Training provided by a state CSO & Local Police Departmen

A local police department with a staff of 20 swom law-enforcement officers and 15 support personnel partnered with the state CSO to implement security awareness training and required all staff to complete this training upon assignment and every two years thereafter. The local police department exhabited the sworn law-enforcement training to coincide with their N-Disk basining. The local police department maintained the behaving records and provided reporting to the state CSD to help it amount compliance with the CSS Security Folice.







TEXAS N-DEX SUCCESS STORY

- Colleyville PD investigating burglaries from lockers at a local fitness center
- Suspects stole wallets from unattended lockers then used the stolen credit and debit cards to purchase products
- Suspects wore masks no facial recognition on security footage
- N-DEx search for locker room and thefts
- Found offense report with matching description of suspects
- Social media profiles matched tattoos and clothing
- Solved incidents in three other agencies

TEXAS N-DEx SUCCESS STORY

- Two deceased gunshot males found by Sheriff's Office
- Sheriff's Office & Tennessee Bureau of Investigations identify two suspects – Mother and Son
- Mother fled Tennessee during investigation
- Searched N-DEx for information on mother
- Residential information found in Longview, Texas
- Mother arrested & extradited back to Tennessee

TEXAS N-DEX SUCCESS STORY

- Las Vegas PD welfare check on woman
- Victim found unconscious in bathtub & minutes away from death
- Victim's family had no contact information for ex-husband since never met him
- Searched N-DEx with ex-husband's name & descriptors
- Extensive criminal history from multiple jurisdictions in Texas including address of ex-husband
- Colorado Task Force arrested
- Extradited ex-husband to back to Las Vegas

TEXAS N-DEX SUCCESS STORY

- New Mexico Corrections Department Security Threat Intelligence Unit trying to locate 2+ dozen probation absconders of serious crimes
 - Burglary, Aggravated Assault, Armed Robbery, Sexual Assault
- Intelligence Criminal Analyst used N-DEx Batch Search and Automatic Notification feature
- Absconders found in local jails in Texas, Colorado,
 Oklahoma, New Mexico & South Carolina
- New Mexico places holds for extradition

DATA BROKER



DATA BROKER

- Data Broker is an avenue of ingesting data and dispersing that data to either N-DEx or NIBRS system.
- Data Broker will take both N-DEx or NIBRS data via XML format.
- Utilizing the Data Broker, will alleviate you from having to create multiple files and upload into multiple locations.
- You will be sharing valuable data to support investigations all with one process.

- N-DEx is an online investigative information sharing system and is available 24/7 from the LEEP secure portal.
- Agencies can get access to the N-DEx System even when they aren't sharing data. It provides centralized "One stop shopping" for investigators, analysts, and Criminal Justice Professionals.
- Data Broker can take either N-DEx or NIBRS XML files.
- Agencies choose what records to share and can set up times for the files will be automatically created and sent to the Data Broker.
