**STATEWIDE CURRENT SITUATION:** As a result of the local jurisdictions transitioning from response to recovery, the State of Texas State Operations Center (SOC) has decreased readiness from Level II (Escalated Response Conditions) to Level III (Increased Readiness) as of 7 PM on 9/23/19.

Governor Abbott declared a State of Disaster for Brazoria, Chambers, Galveston, Hardin, Harris, Jasper, Jefferson, Liberty, Matagorda, Montgomery, Newton, Orange and San Jacinto counties on 9/19/19.

**Current Weather Situation:** No hazardous weather is forecast in the affected areas for today. Flooding will continue along portions of the lower Neches River, Pine Island Bayou and Cow Bayou through the later part of the week.

**OPERATIONAL PRIORITIES:**

1. Protect life and property.
2. Support rapid & effective response.
3. Collect and disseminate accurate incident information to improve decision-making.
4. Accurately, track incident costs associated with assigned resources for cost recovery.

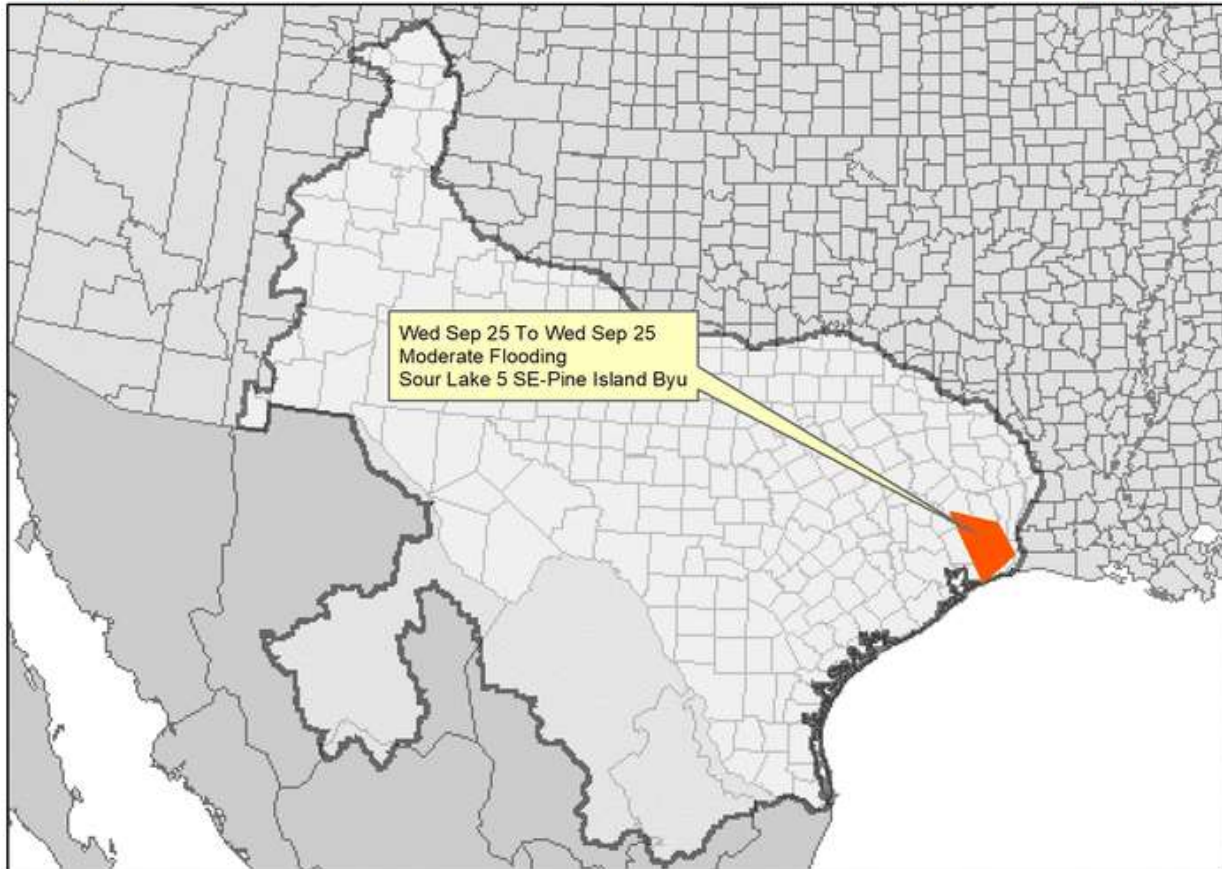


# Significant River Flood Outlook

## Region 2 (Includes DDCs 13, 14, 15, 16 Houston, 16 Texas City, 16 Conroe, and 16 Rosenberg)

**DDC 14 – Lufkin** (Includes Angelina, Houston, Jasper, Nacogdoches, Newton, Polk, Sabine, San Augustine, San Jacinto, Shelby, Trinity, and Tyler Counties) – Newton County issued a Disaster Declaration on 9/19/19, submitted a Disaster Summary Outline update #1 on 9/25/19.

**DDC 15 – Beaumont** (Includes Hardin, Jefferson, and Orange Counties) – Hardin County issued a Disaster Declaration on 9/19/19 and submitted a Disaster Summary Outline on 9/21/19. Flood levels fell for Pine Island Bayou and the Neches River, entering Minor Flood Stage on 9/25/19. The Cities of Nederland and Port Arthur issued Disaster Declarations on 9/19/19. Jefferson County submitted Disaster Summary Outline update #1 on 9/22/19. The City of Beaumont submitted Disaster Summary Outline update #7 on 9/24/19. DC 20 – Corpus Christi is assisting at the Jefferson County EOC. Orange County issued a Disaster Declaration

on 9/19/19 and Disaster Summary Outline update #3 on 9/25/19. The City of Pinehurst issued a Disaster Declaration and submitted a letter to the Governor on 9/19/19, and submitted Disaster Summary Outline update #1 on 9/25/19. The City of West Orange issued a Disaster Declaration on 9/19/19. The City of Orange submitted a Disaster Summary Outline update #1 on 9/24/19. The City's emergency curfew remains in effect with revised times of 11 PM to 5 AM. The Neches River near Beaumont is in minor flood stage and continues receding. DC 4A - Hurst is assisting at the Orange County EOC. DC 13 – Bryan will be demobilizing from the EOC 9/25/19.

**DDC 16A – Houston** (Includes Chambers, and Harris Counties) -Chambers County issued a Disaster Declaration on 9/18/19, submitted a Letter to the Governor on 9/19/19 and Disaster Summary Outline #7 on 9/25/19. An emergency overnight curfew was issued for the Winnie-Stowell area from 10 PM to 6 AM Chambers County EOC will be closing at 1700 hours on 9/27/19. EOC operations will return to regular duties and any Recovery will be handled through the County Emergency Management Office. Harris County issued a Disaster Declaration on 9/19/19 and submitted Disaster Summary Outline update #2 on 9/24/19. The City of Bellaire submitted a Disaster Summary Outline on 9/19/19.-The Cities of Baytown and Bunker Hill submitted Disaster Summary Outlines on 9/23/19. The City of Houston issued a Disaster Declaration, submitted a letter to the Governor on 9/20/19 and Disaster Summary Outline update #3 on 9/24/19.

**DDC 16B – Texas City** (Includes Brazoria and Galveston Counties) – The City of Lake Jackson submitted a Disaster Summary Outline on 9/20/19. The City of Freeport submitted a Disaster Summary Outline on 9/24/19. The City of Angleton submitted a Disaster Summary Outline on 9/23/19. County Judge Sebesta declined public/ individual assistance on 9/24/19. Galveston County issued a Disaster Declaration on 9/19/19 and submitted a Disaster Summary Outline on 9/20/19. The City of Dickinson issued a Disaster Declaration on 9/17/19. The City of Galveston submitted Disaster Summary Outline update #1 on 9/21/19.

**DDC 16C – Conroe** (Includes Liberty, Montgomery, and Walker Counties) –Liberty County issued a Disaster Declaration on 9/19/19 and submitted a Disaster Summary Outline on 9/21/19. The Cities of Liberty, Ames, and Devers issued Disaster Declarations and submitted a letters to the Governor on 9/19/19. The Cities of Cleveland, Dayton, and Hardin issued Disaster Declarations on 9/19/19. The Cities of Ames, Cleveland, Liberty, and Plum Grove submitted Disaster Summary Outlines on 9/23/19. Montgomery County Office of Emergency Management (OEM) activated the Montgomery County Medical Reserve Corps (MRC) to assist with local shelter operations. They are primarily utilizing medical volunteers, supplemented by volunteers of all backgrounds. Montgomery County issued a Disaster Declaration 9/21/19 and submitted a Disaster Summary Outline update #1 on 9/25/19. The City of Conroe issued a Disaster Declaration on 9/21/19.

**DDC 16D – Rosenberg** (Includes: Austin, Colorado, Fort Bend, Matagorda and Wharton Counties) - Matagorda County submitted a Disaster Summary Outline on 9/24/19.

## **RESPONDING STATE AGENCIES/ORGANIZATIONS REPORTS**

**Texas A&M Forest Service (TFS):** TFS is currently providing staffing of the SOC to support the ongoing activation. One Short Type 3 IMT to Jefferson County EOC and one planning module remain assigned to DDC 15-Beaumont. Additionally, TFS is providing management and support for POD operations in Jefferson and Orange counties.

**Texas Intrastate Fire Mutual Aid System (TIFMAS):** TIFMAS has a Strike Team of three engines and one Strike Team Leader assigned to Hardin County for damage assessment assistance and backfill for local fire departments. TIFMAS is currently scheduled to demobilize on 9/27/19. A TIFMAS strike team of two engines, one water tender and one Strike Team Leader is operating in Orange County to support local fire departments that have flood damaged equipment. A TIFMAS strike team of three water tenders are operating on the Bolivar Peninsula in Galveston County to support firefighting missions while municipal water supplies are depleted. A TIFMAS strike team of three engines, three water tenders and one Strike Team Leader is assigned to Jefferson County to backfill for local fire departments. Resources will be required through the weekend due to limited local personnel resources.

**Texas A&M Task Force 1 (TX-TF1):** SOC liaison remains activated in support of TDEM recovery efforts. TX-TF1 has assumed normal status for SAR resources statewide.

**Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service (Agrilife):** Agrilife has activated 21 Extension Agents to assist TDEM by making onsite observations and completing assessment reports for Orange, Jasper, Jefferson, and Newton Counties. One Extension Agent Strike Team was released from Chambers County on 9/25/19. Two agency personnel continue to operate an animal shelter in Chambers and Jefferson Counties, as well as helping with hay distribution. Jefferson County is continuing hay drops by airboat to stranded livestock in the county. Livestock locations are being identified by helicopter. There are currently 5 horses and 8 goats remaining at the ASP. The remaining hay delivery from STAR request 15-69186 will be delivered 9/26/19 to Fords Park ASP. Chambers County White’s Park reported 10 dogs, 2 cats and some cattle remaining at the ASP. The cattle are expected to be moved out today (Thursday). Their hay inventory is approximately 100 square bales remaining. They expect to close within the next two days. The Extension publication entitled “Shock Chlorination of Water Wells” was routed to TDEM to include on the TDEM website in anticipation of water well contamination issues post flood

**Texas A&M Veterinarian (VET):** The TAMU Veterinary Emergency Team and three (3) Extension Agents on the ASP Strike Team demobilized Wednesday, 9/25/19.

**Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM):** The TDEM State Operations Center conducted a response and recovery conference call on Wednesday and will continue conducting conference calls as needed. TDEM District Coordinators from unaffected areas of the state have deployed into Region 2 to assist the local jurisdictions either at the DDC level or within the local EOCs.

**TDEM Recovery Unit:** The TDEM Recovery Unit is reviewing the Disaster Summary Outlines and preparing TDEM staff to coordinate and conduct Preliminary Damage Assessments (PDAs)

in the affected areas. IA / SBA Preliminary Damage Assessments began on 9/22/19. The Disaster Support and Recovery Task Force has rostered available personnel and are standing by to support requests from local jurisdictions that are received in the SOC. PDA teams started operations on Monday, 9/23/19 for Jefferson and Orange Counties. Montgomery and Chambers Counties PDAs began Tuesday, 9/24/19. Harris County PDA will begin operations on Thursday, 9/26/19.

**Texas Animal Health Commission (TAHC):** TAHC representative is staffing the SOC during the day-shift to help coordinate state-wide animal issues operations. TAHC staff is in contact with local animal care and sheltering facilities and organizations to determine operational status and needs. TAHC personnel are in contact with agency partners, stakeholder, NGO partners, and various veterinary organizations to determine capabilities and respond to post-storm animal issues. TAHC is working cooperatively with Texas A&M Agrilife and county livestock officials to deliver hay to stranded cattle in Chambers and Jefferson Counties. One Field Team with portable corral and Squeeze Chute was released from Chambered County as of 9/25/19.

**Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ):** TCEQ staff continues to assess any issues with drinking water and wastewater treatment plants. Staff contacted 367 wastewater treatment plants and 80 drinking water plants. The City of Rose City, Harris County MUD 54, Derwood Subdivision, Crystal Forest Subdivision, Maywood Acres, Dow Freeport and Harris County MUD 21 remains under a boil water notice. Eighteen orphaned containers will be picked up in Jefferson County and east Chambers County. The region is also tracking the remediation of 11 spills in the area.

**Texas Department of Agriculture (TDA):** TDA continues coordinating the delivery of hay to feed cattle and horses in Jefferson and Chambers Counties. In the early evening Tuesday, 9/24/19 upwards of 300-400 cattle emerged from a pasture in Jefferson County. A Star request was received for additional bales of hay. A financial request by TAHC with TDEM was made for additional hay. TDEM granted the request to purchase 700 square bales Wednesday morning and it will be shipped directly to Ford Park. Estimated delivery time is Friday 9/27/19 the primary point of interest is the disposal of carcasses.

**Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS):** DPS, Texas Highway Patrol (THP) is currently providing staffing at the SOC in support of the ongoing activation.

**Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS):** Final delivery of all vaccines were completed on Wednesday, 9/25/19. Chambers County cancelled a request for aerial spraying against vectors.

**Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT):** TxDOT is providing staffing at the SOC, monitoring this system and is prepared to assist as needed. TxDOT is actively updating drivetexas.org with road condition changes. TxDOT is currently working to secure an agreement with Hardin County for debris removal assistance in their local communities. IH 10 has fully reopened, SH 124 in Jefferson County is the only closed roadway.

**Texas Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC):** The HHSC SOC Liaison is collecting, documenting and sharing situational awareness information, responding to inquiries, and monitoring state requests for HHSC-provided assets. HHSC has received 17 State of Texas Assistance Request (STARs) for water/ice. ERM continues to staff the HHSC SOC Liaison position on day shift. HHSC is collecting documentation and initiating planning to apply for relevant waivers and to potentially initiate DSNAP in affected counties. Two HHSC staff

members are supporting Individual Assistance / Small Business Administration Preliminary Damage Assessments in Montgomery, Harris Orange and Chambers Counties.

**Texas Information and Referral Network (2-1-1 TIRN):** The 2-1-1 TIRN team is actively monitoring telephony statistics to ensure adequate Network call taking capacity and is communicating with the Network providers and call specialists.

**Texas Military Department (TMD):** TMD currently has activated 140 personnel in support of the September Severe Weather response. TMD has one Ground Transportation Company with two platoons conducting Point of Distribution commodities distribution missions in Jefferson County. Six Expedient Response Teams (EXR) are assigned to operate six Points of Distribution (POD) in Jefferson (4) and Orange (2) Counties in support of TFS. TMD has one Military District Coordinator supporting DDC 15 and two teams supporting the State Operations Center.

**Volunteer Agencies Active in Disaster (VOAD):**

**American Red Cross (ARC):** Fixed feeding is occurring at all shelter locations. The ARC is operating a kitchen in partnership with Texas Baptist Men. The kitchen is based in Nederland, and is servicing multiple counties. ARC produced 2,000 hot meals for dinner Wednesday based upon community assessment/needs. The number of meals for dinner will be determined by ongoing needs assessments. Mobile teams are operating in Jefferson and Orange Counties providing and distributing clean up kits and water. There are 15 Damage Assessment Teams in Liberty, Montgomery, Harris, Jefferson, Chambers and Orange Counties. Mobile feeding routes for 15 ERVs have been established: Orange County, Mauriceville, Orange, Jefferson County, Port Neches, Nederland, Vidor, Pine Forrest, Beaumont and NE Jefferson County.

**Feeding Texas:** To date; the Houston Food Bank has distributed 678 prepared meals in support of shelters in Chambers County.

**Southern Baptists of Texas Convention (SBTC):** SBTC has 16 units activated and has accumulated 1,710 volunteer hours.

**The Salvation Army (TSA):** TSA continues to coordinate with state and local emergency management across the affected areas. They are engaged with local and state VOAD partners as well as active Long-Term Recovery Groups helping to identify resources for recovery efforts. TSA is also working with local community organizations accepting donations and supplying cleaning and other relief supplies. TSA is engaged and coordinating with the State Feeding Task Force members to identify potential gaps in feeding and to determine mobile and fixed feedings sites as volunteer groups come into the area helping to muck out homes. TSA is continuing to coordinate with all community, state, and local partners as they support local recovery and clean-up efforts. TSA is participating in the state recovery calls as well as the Texas VOAD recovery coordination calls.

In Liberty County, TSA service unit, in coordination with local partners, has provided clean-up kits, food boxes and other relief supplies for those in affected communities.

In Chambers County, starting 9/26/19, TSA will partner with St Vincent DePaul (SVDP) providing a truck load of cleanup kits and food boxes in the City of Winnie at St. Louis Catholic Church. TSA will also have the TSA of Bryan College Station canteen onsite providing snacks and hydration.

In Harris County, TSA with the NW Corps feeding unit provided meals, hydration and clean up kits to the areas of Kingwood and along Westheimer and Hampstead. Salvation Army of Houston continues to reach out to affected communities and provide clean-ups kits and water as needed

In Orange County, TSA is supporting POD locations in Mauriceville and Vidor with blankets. They also provided 1,000 clean up kits and a pallet of paper towels to the Orange Disaster Assistance Group who is supporting the local community with clean up via local churches and other civic organizations.

In Jefferson County, TSA received 100 individuals for shelter at their gym in support of county evacuations. TSA of Beaumont will continue to support the local surrounding communities with relief supplies out of their Beaumont disaster warehouse as needed. A shower unit has been deployed to support operations.

In Montgomery County, TSA of Conroe is coordinating with the community of Patton Village providing clean-up kits and hot meals. TSA Conroe visited the areas of Woodbranch and Roman Forrest doing assessments and providing emotional and spiritual care.

Service Delivery as of 9/25/19: 2,554 meals; 6,432 snacks and drinks; 2,854 clean-up kits, 370 food boxes, 380 infant supplies, and 1 shower unit.
