### On the road in an evacuation

- If you plan to stay in a hotel or motel, make reservations and confirm your reservations before you leave.
- Learn the places to stay between your home and your destination – in case you have to stop.
- Highways will be crowded. Expect your trip to take longer than usual. Watch for Texas Department of Transportation highway signs for information. Monitor the situation on your car radio.
- When a hurricane threatens, don't make traffic worse. Get your extra vehicles out early. If you wait to leave until local officials call for a mandatory evacuation – take only one vehicle.
- Be smart. If you want to travel with a boat, a camper, an extra car or truck – leave the evacuation zone BEFORE local officials order a mandatory evacuation.
