What to bring with you when you are applying as a Teen Driver for your Provisional Driver License

There are two phases you will need to complete before graduating to a full driver license. This is called the Graduated Driver License Program for teens. To be issued a *provisional driver license (phase II)* in the state of Texas, you must bring the following documentation to your local driver license office:

- 1. <u>Application</u> for a Provisional Texas Driver License
- 2. Proof of Identity (Your Texas Learner License is sufficient)
- 3. Evidence of Lawful Status (If you are not a U.S. Citizen)
- 4. Provide Social Security Number
- 5. Proof of Completion for an Impact Texas Driver (ITD) course
- 6. Proof of Completion for Driver Education
- 7. Proof of Insurance (if you will be taking a driving test)
- 8. Issuance Fee

This checklist will help you identify what documents in each section you will need to bring to your local driver license office so that you may obtain your provisional DL. Follow the directions listed for each section, and check the appropriate document(s) you have that you can bring with you.

Upon completing all sections, gather the documents you have checked, and along with your parent or legal guardian, visit your local driver license office to begin the issuance process. Section 2. Proof of U.S. Citizenship or Lawful Presence

If you are a United States Citizen and have already presented this documentation to the Department, you may skip this section and proceed to Section 3. If you have a Limited-Term Texas driver license, you will be required to present updated evidence of lawful presence. Most documents will be verified through the US Department of Homeland Security's SAVE Program. Verification through SAVE is often instantaneous, but when it is not, receipt of the DL/ID may be delayed for up to 30 days.

Check one document you have from this list that contains your full legal name. This will be your proof of U.S. Citizenship or Lawful Presence in the United States.

Section 3. Proof of Impact Texas Driver (ITD) Course completion and Driving Test

You must have successfully completed an ITD program within 90 days of taking your driving test. Select one:

- □ I have completed the ITD Course and driving test at a Certified Driver Training School and will be bringing the driving test results to the driver license office in a sealed, unaltered envelope
- □ I have completed the ITD Course and driving test through a Public School Driver Education Program and will be bringing the driving test results to the driver license office in a sealed, unaltered envelope
- □ I have completed the ITD course within the previous 90 days and will be taking the driving test at my local driver license office. I will be bringing my ITD Course completion Certificate.

Section 4. Provide Social Security Number

You must provide your social security number. If the number is not already part of your driver record, the Department will verify SSN number electronically with the Social Security Administration (SSA). If the SSN cannot be verified, the Department will be unable to issue your Provisional License and additional instructions will be provided.

Section 5. Driver Education

You must provide a certificate of completion from your course provider for both the classroom and behind-the-wheel portions of driver education. Select one:

- Commercial Driver Training School (Form DE-964)
- □ Parent Taught Driver Education (Form DE-964)
- □ Public School Driver Education (Form DE-964)

Section 6. Proof of Insurance

If you have not taken the driving skills exam during driver education, you will be required to successfully pass the drive test at your local driver license office. Once you have completed all of the requirements on this checklist, you may schedule your drive test at https://txdpsscheduler.com/

Proof of Insurance (for the vehicle you will be using for the driving skills exam, if applicable)

Upon completing all sections, gather the documents you have checked and bring them to your local driver license office to begin the renewal process.
