Course Descriptions:

NIBRS Overview – This presentation highlights the roles and responsibilities of UCR agencies and DPS UCR Program staff. Participants will gain a basic understanding of UCR reporting and how to upload a NIBRS file via the DPS on-line system as well as identify, review, and correct the errors that are created from the monthly submission file.

Group A Offenses - Crimes Against Property - This class is for participants to gain a greater understanding of Crimes Against Property where the object of the offense is to obtain money, property, or some other benefit along with which data elements are mandatory when reporting these offenses including types of victims required.

Group B Offenses – This class highlights the seven NIBRS Group B Offenses that are not Group A Offenses for Texas NIBRS reporting agencies. Students will learn which offenses are no longer reportable, when to report Group B Offenses, and learn examples of various Group B Offenses.

<u>Molly Jane's Law and ViCAP</u> – This presentation will help you understand the basics of House Bill 3106 Molly Jane's Law, and the Texas requirements for law enforcement agencies on reporting incidents that apply to Molly Jane's Law.

NIBRS errors and How to Fix Them — This in-depth presentation highlights NIBRS errors, warnings, where to locate errors in the DPS system, and how to correct them.

NIBRS Overview and Manual Entry - This class is for participants who are new to NIBRS reporting due to HB4879 and will give an overview of the DPS UCR Program as well as a step-by-step guide to manually entering a NIBRS incident and zero report in the DPS UCR Repository. (Agencies without an RMS only)

<u>Use of Force Overview and Manual Entry</u> – This class is for those agencies who are already participating in the voluntary National Use of Force program and will be viewing the Texas DPS Use of Force Portal for entry of Use of Force incidents and zero reports.

Attendees will receive an MS Teams invite link for the course. Downloading or having an account with MS Teams is not required and is available via browser extension through the registration link.
