## **Course Descriptions:**

**Cargo Theft/Hate Crime:** The presentation will provide an overview of Cargo Theft and Hate Crime. Including offenses, scenarios, and quality control checks. Law Enforcement agencies will be able to identify the types of bias crimes and Cargo Theft to be reported, and to provide guidelines for accurate reporting of both.

**Group A Offenses: Crimes Against Persons:** This class is for participants to gain a greater understanding of Crimes Against Persons whose victims are always individuals along with which data elements are mandatory when reporting these offenses.

**Group A Offenses: Crimes Against Property:** Class is for participants to gain a greater understanding of Crimes Against Property where the object of the offense is to obtain money, property, or some other benefit, along with which data elements are mandatory when reporting these offenses, including types of victims required.

**Crimes Against Society:** This class aims to provide participants with a deeper understanding of Crimes Against Society, whose victims are always Society, as well as the mandatory data elements required when reporting these offenses.

**Group B Offenses:** This class highlights the seven NIBRS Group B Offenses that are not Group A offenses for Texas UCR reporting agencies. Students will learn which offenses are no longer reportable, when to report Group B Offenses, and be provided with examples of various Group B Offenses.

**Molly Jane's Law and ViCAP:** This presentation will help you understand the basics of House Bill 3106, Molly Jane's Law, and the Texas requirements for law enforcement agencies on reporting incidents that apply to Molly Jane's Law.

**N-DEx Overview & Audit:** This course will provide an understanding of what NDEx is, the importance of sharing information, and how it is shared via the Data Broker from local agencies to the FBI. This course also offers an overview of the N-DEx audit, detailing expectations during the process and defining necessary documentation.

**NIBRS Errors and Warnings:** This in-depth presentation highlights NIBRS errors, warnings, where to locate errors in the DPS system, and how to correct them.

**NIBRS Overview:** This presentation highlights the roles and responsibilities of UCR agencies and DPS UCR Program staff. Participants will gain a basic understanding of UCR reporting and learn how to upload a NIBRS file via the DPS online system, as well as identify, review, and correct errors created by the monthly submission file.

**NIBRS Overview for ISD Police:** The goal of this course is for participants to gain a

greater understanding of the basics of NIBRS, which are applicable to ISD Police, and include juvenile clearances, common NIBRS offenses, sexual assault reporting, school-related scenarios, common ISD errors and warnings, along with where to locate NIBRS Technical Documentation for assistance. **(ISD PDs or SROs only)**

**Texas Specific Errors:** This course will introduce and inform law enforcement agencies about the Texas Specific Errors and Warnings that they face in their Uniform Crime Reporting.

**Texas Specific Reports:** This course will help you better understand the background and need for these Texas Mandates, as well as how their reporting differs from FBI reporting. It will provide guidance on how to effectively report these mandates in your NIBRS file.

**Use of Force Overview & Manual Entry:** This class is designed to help participants gain a deeper understanding of the National Use of Force program, highlighting the differences between the Texas OAG-mandated reporting and the National program. Instructions on how to join the National Use of Force program. You will also see the Texas DPS Use of Force Portal. How to enter Use of Force incidents and zero reports.
