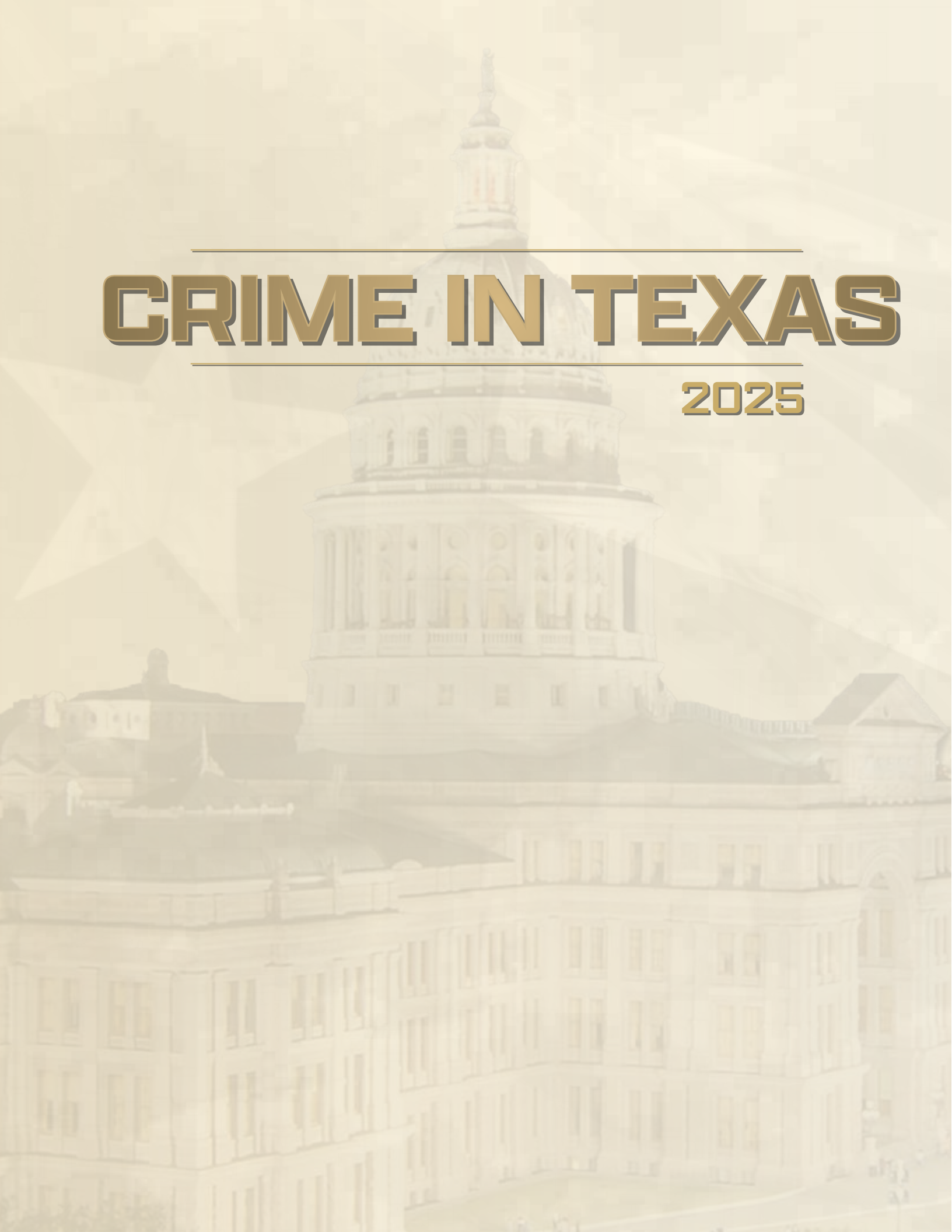


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# CRIME IN TEXAS

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2025



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# Introduction

*Since its inception in 1930, the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) program has presented summary-based totals for the main index crimes (i.e., Murder, Rape, Robbery, Aggravated Assault, Burglary, Motor Vehicle Theft, and Larceny/Theft). Arson and Human Trafficking were later added. The program has now matured to the more-detailed National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS) methodology.*

The Texas UCR program serves as the state repository for the collection of crime statistics. The program's primary objective is to generate reliable information for law enforcement administration, operation, and management. Policymakers and members of the public, including the media and academia, rely upon this data to understand year-to-year fluctuations in crime levels in their communities across the state.

The Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) supports accuracy in reporting through training and quality control checks on the data submissions it receives from the more than 1,600 law enforcement agencies. While DPS takes steps to verify the validity of incoming data, each reporting agency is responsible for adhering to established standards and correcting any errors in their submissions.

The annual Crime in Texas publication provides a static year-to-year comparison and five-year data trends. DPS has also developed an online tool, the [UCR Crime in Texas portal](#), to offer on-demand access to the richer crime data being reported.

**After the release of last year's 2024 Crime in Texas report, DPS has begun a two-year transition to streamline the annual report. The 2025 report focuses on overall crime trends and highlights the Top 25 Jurisdictions by population size and/or crime volume.**

To continue promoting transparency and public access to detailed data, DPS has included Supplemental Reports for 2025 on our [DPS Crime in Texas web page](#).

For inclusion in this 2025 Crime in Texas report, data must have been reported by March 20, 2026. The information in this publication is retrieved from local agency NIBRS reports. The UCR portal presents both NIBRS and summary-format data. While the annual publication reflects a static snapshot, the portal displays dynamic data that may be updated as agencies submit or revise records.

## Reporting is Now Mandated by Texas Statute

The annual Crime in Texas report analyzes reported crime incidents using data from participating law enforcement agencies that submit information to the Texas UCR program. DPS also uses this data to produce ad hoc reports and fulfill public information requests throughout the year. DPS program staff actively monitor submissions for anomalies and collaborate with agencies to ensure data accuracy.

Historically, the UCR program was voluntary, leading to inconsistent monthly data submissions, which hampered the ability of state and municipal governments, law enforcement agencies, academic entities, and the public to obtain a reliable depiction of crime in Texas.

The 88th Texas Legislature (2023) enacted amendments to Texas Government Code §411.054 mandating local law enforcement agencies (1) implement a NIBRS compliant reporting system, and (2) use that reporting system to submit NIBRS data to the Texas UCR program.

## Measuring Crime in Texas by Volume and Rate

The Crime in Texas report presents both the rate and volume of crimes. The crime rate is the number of identified offenses per 100,000 people, which allows for consistent comparisons between years and among agencies of different sizes. The FBI provides yearly population estimates for each reporting jurisdiction based on Census Bureau data. Crime volume, on the other hand, is simply the total number of reported incidents.

## Texas-Specific Reporting Requirements

In addition to the index crimes, the report also includes Texas offense categories and indicators that agencies are required to report. These are Sexual Assault (category), Drug Seizures (category), Family Violence (indicator), and Hate Crime (indicator).

## Clearances

An offense is cleared when a law enforcement agency arrests an offender for the offense. The arrest of one person can clear several crimes or several persons may be arrested in the process of clearing one offense.

Law enforcement agencies may also clear a crime by exceptional means when all four of the following criteria are met: (1) The agency has established the identity of the offender; (2) enough evidence exists to support an arrest, charge, and turning over to the court for prosecution; (3) the exact location of the offender is known so that the subject could be taken into custody now; and (4) some element beyond law enforcement control precludes arresting, charging, and prosecuting the offender.

Clearances are reflected in the same year the incident was reported, regardless of when the offense was cleared. For example, if a case is cleared in 2025 for a 2024 incident, the clearance will be included in the 2024 clearance totals, not in the 2025 statistics.

## Additional Notes for Data Throughout this Report

(1) Due to rounding and statistical insignificance, some percentage values within the report may appear as 0.00.

(2) Due to rounding, some crime rates and percentages are shown as two decimal places and may not add up to 100.00% or match combined subtotals.

(3) Population totals reflect participating agency jurisdictions, not the overall Texas population.

(4) Due to the nature of the crime statistics collected, some demographic information for the offender and/or victim may be unknown or partially unknown.

(5) The FBI only provides population estimates for city police departments (PDs) and county sheriff offices (Co So). In heavily populated areas, the population is assigned to city police departments, and there is no remaining population assigned to the county sheriff's office.

(6) Some agency types overlap jurisdictions with the city or county and are not assigned a population by the FBI. These are considered "Zero Population" agencies and Crime rates cannot be calculated for these agencies.

(7) In NIBRS, Rape offenses include 11A (Forcible Rape), 11B (Sodomy), and 11C (Sexual Assault with an Object), unless otherwise noted.

(8) Larceny/Theft includes all types of larceny/theft, except motor vehicle theft.

# Top 25 by Highest Jurisdictional Population & Index Crime Volume

The Crime in Texas report uses FBI population estimates for Texas jurisdictions to calculate crime rates and for consistency in reporting. Population trends show that Texas continues to be one of the fastest growing states. While the FBI estimates show a decline in major cities' population density, the data shows a shift in population into surrounding cities and county areas.

## Top 25 Index Crime Rate by Agency, Five-Year Comparison

### HIGHLIGHT

All agencies in the Top 25 had a decrease in crime rate from 2024-2025, with Frisco PD showing the largest at -21.87%. El Paso PD was the only agency in a five-year period to have an increase in crime rate at 3.99%.

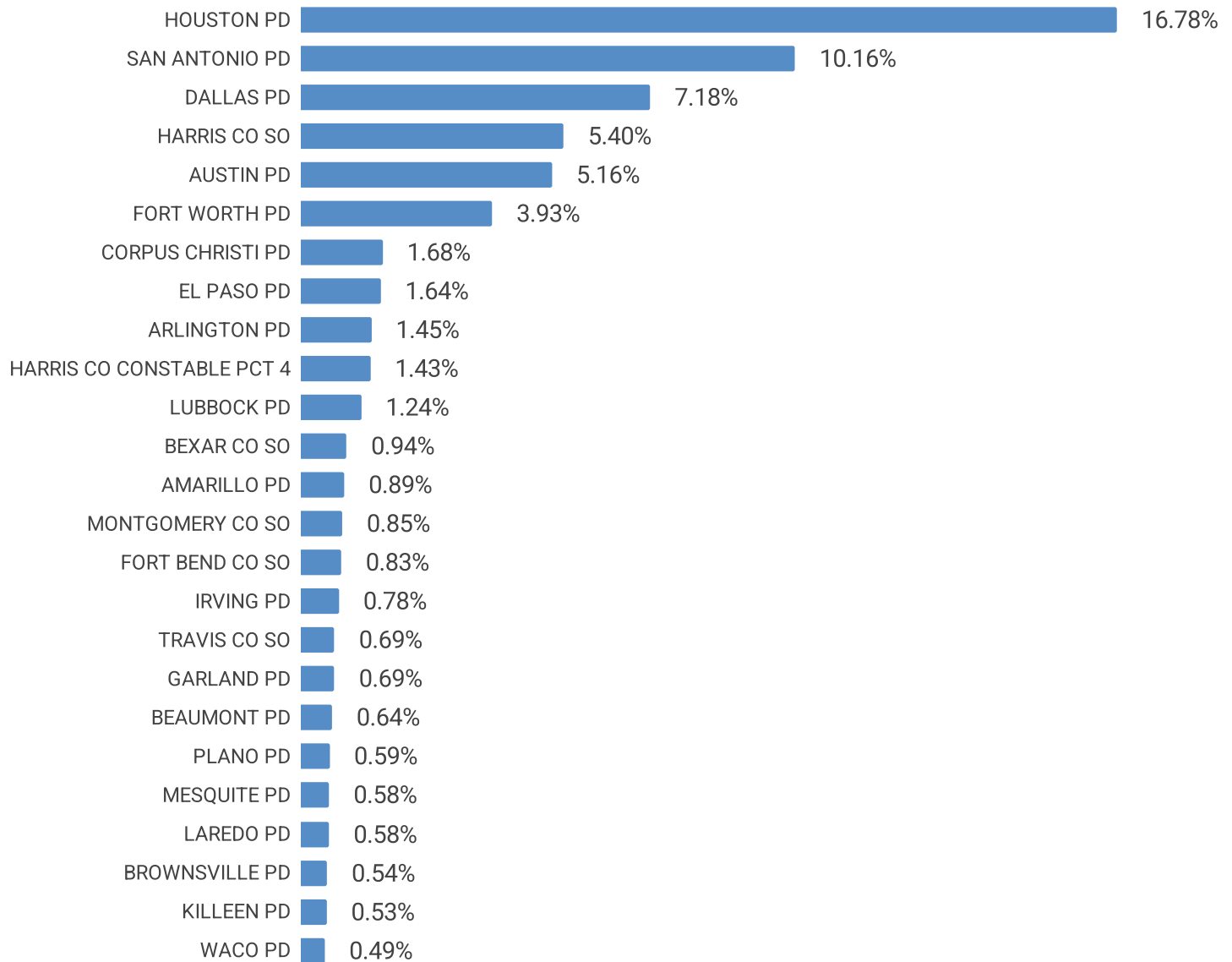

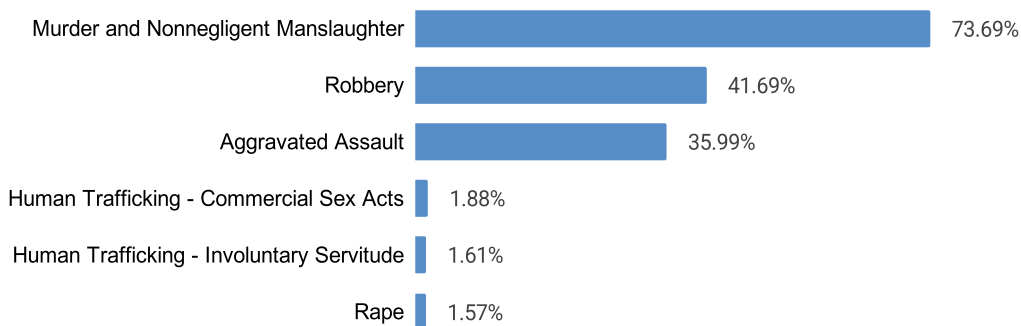

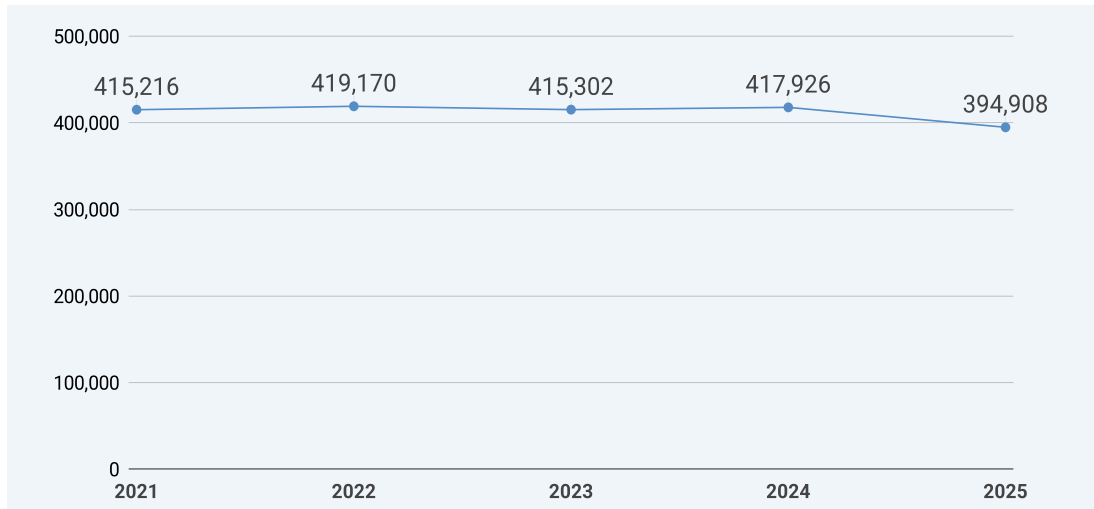

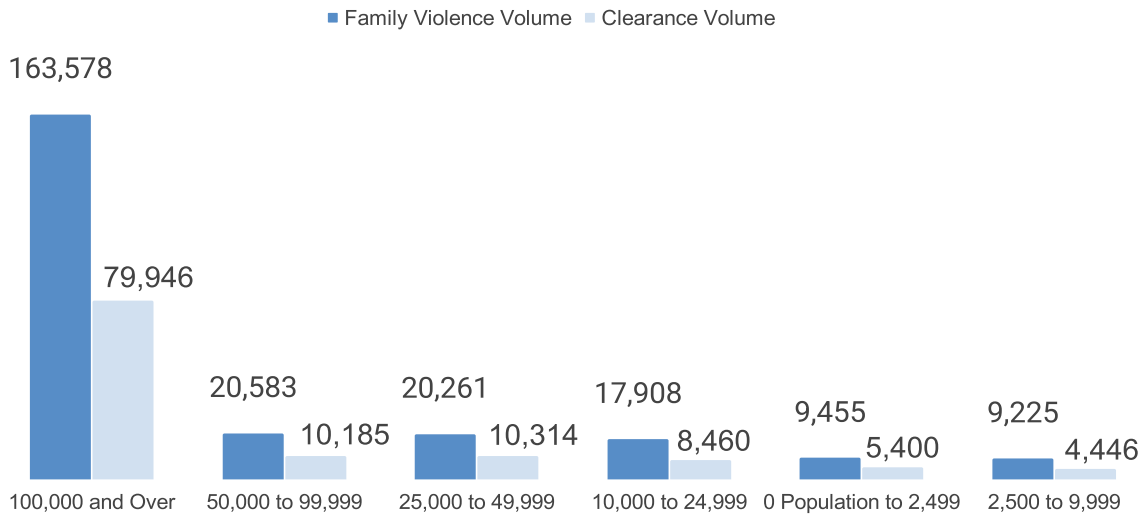

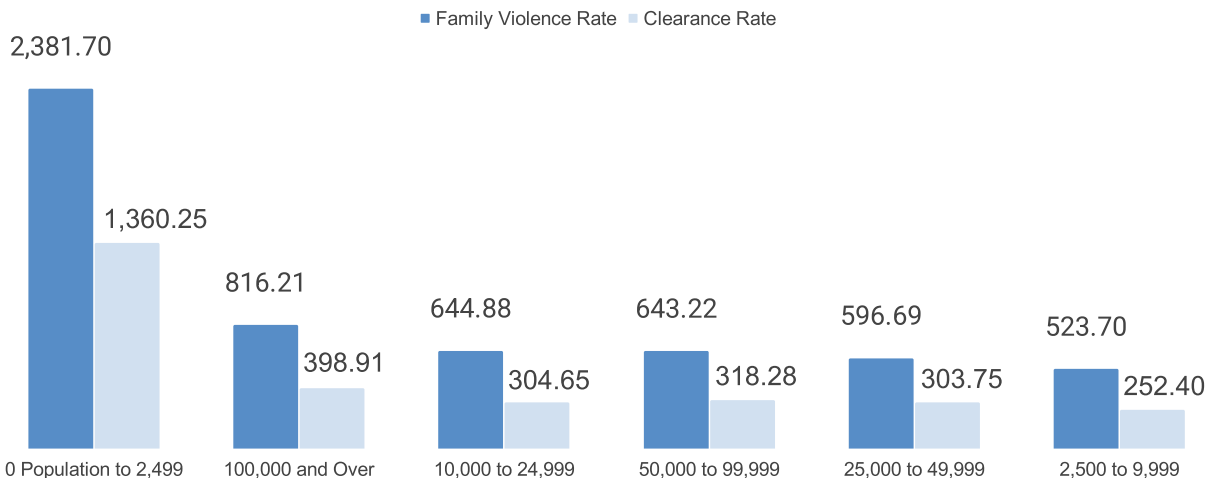

## Family Violence Crime Rate and Clearance Rate by Population Range

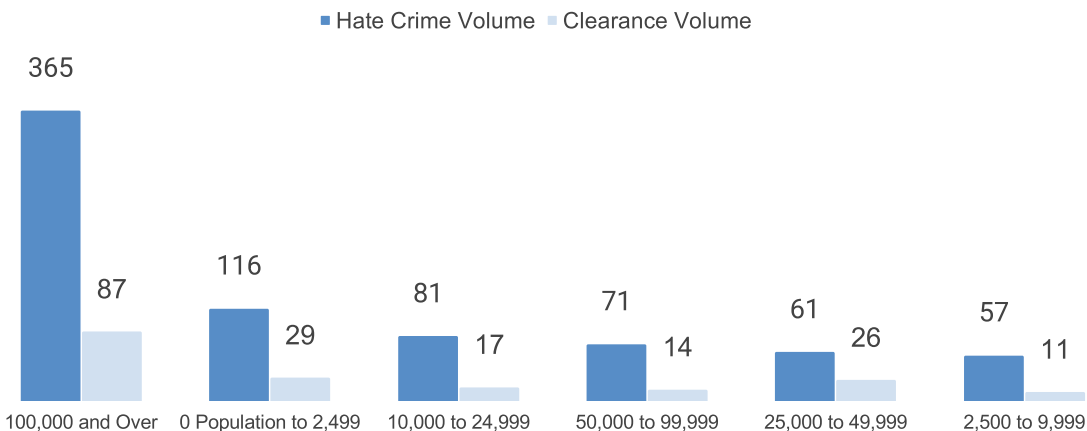

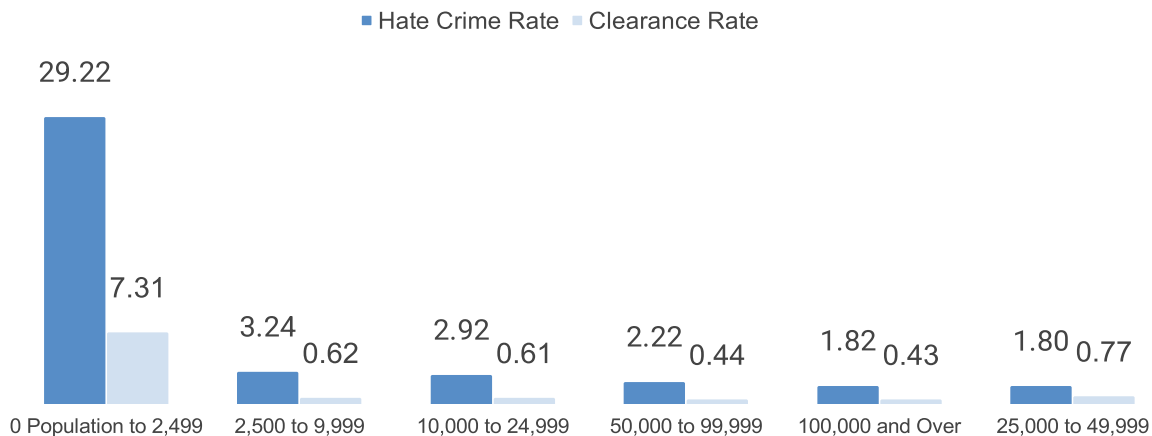

## Hate Crime Rate and Clearance Rate by Population Range



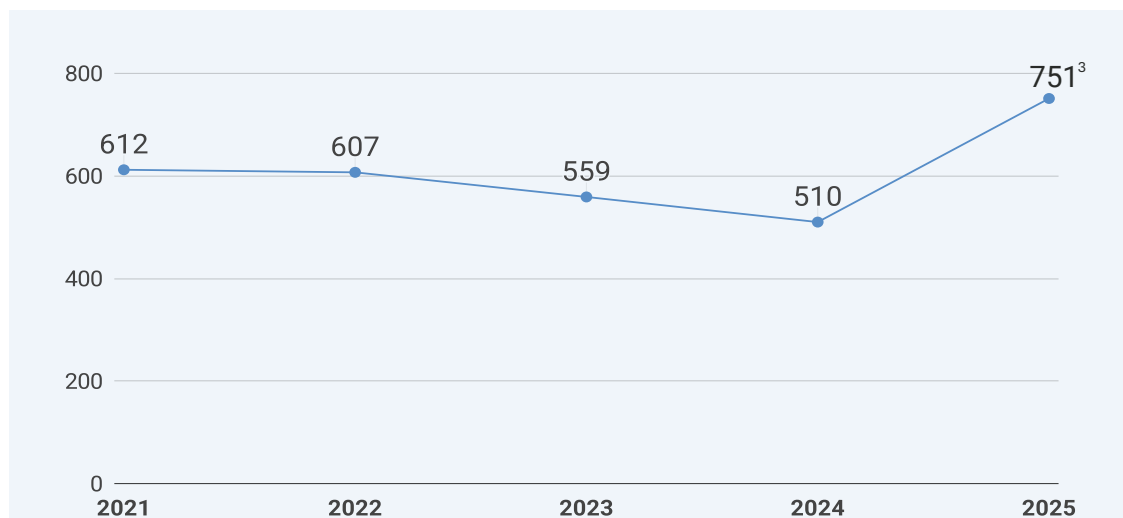

Hate crime has increased by 47.25% compared to 2024. Of the hate crime offenses reported in 2025, 33.56% are from agencies that had reported none in the previous year.

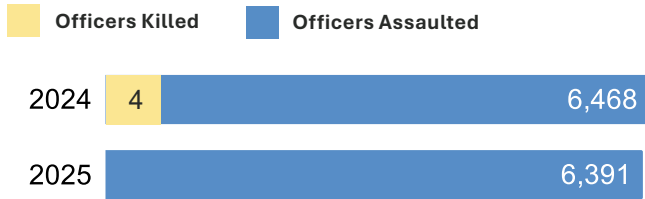

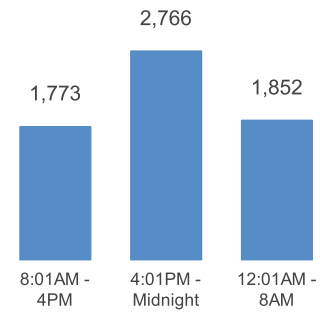

## 2024 vs 2025 Officers Killed and Assaulted



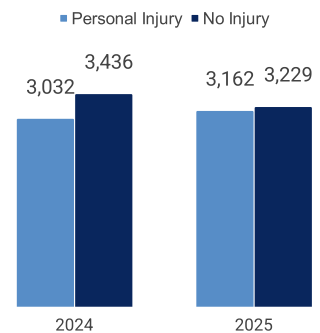
