# Radio ID's and Encryption:



- SWIC office has assumed responsibility for coordinating the “5 Million” ID's for State and Federal partners
- SWIC office is responsible for coordination of CKR/KEY ID's for encryption
- Encryption working group formed and tasked with:
  - Developing a plan for future coordination
  - Developing a plan to migrate agencies to AES (Advanced Encryption Standard)

# Radio ID's and Encryption:



- SWIC office is no longer coordinating new CKRs for ADP/ARC4 or DES
- Agencies requesting encryption keys that will be shared with outside agencies will be directed to an existing regional or federal shared key
- New CKR/KID's should be for internal agency use only
- Trunked Radio System managers should consider using a Federal shared key for System Level Patch Key and on Interoperability Channels

# Texas Radio Rodeo

Provides an opportunity for local first responders to test interoperability and determine needed changes in radio programming and SOP's to enhance coordination and communication efforts

Provides an opportunity to test regional responder interoperability

Designed to be a Table-Top exercise to assess the participants ability to effectively conduct radio operations, evaluate coordination efforts to communicate with local, regional, state, and federal partners, and share real-time related preparation, response, and recovery solutions

Regions will select a County to be “host” event location

Planned for one exercise per month over the next two years

RGCOG – February

MRGDC – March



# Focus Group and Interoperability Level Surveys



2026 Surveys will open from February 2026 through March 2026.

COGs hold Focus Group Meetings with all their First Responder agencies to complete both the Focus Group and Interoperability Level surveys.

# What is a Focus Group Meeting?

The purpose of the meeting is for agencies within a region to get together and share successes and issues from the interoperable communications point of view

The Focus Group meeting should be attended by as many agencies as possible so that answers to the questions in the survey represent the region as a whole.

The annual meeting is a required COG activity in the SCIP

COGs that do not submit a survey will be identified in the 2026 Legislative report

# Focus Group Survey

Asks questions about how well the region plans and works together

- Committee Meetings
- SOPs
- RICPs – Many are at or near 5 years and need to be refreshed

Does the region participate in communications drills and exercises?

Opportunity to recognize regional successes and accomplishments

# Focus Group Survey

Identify gaps that remain in the region to achieve 'Level 5' communications

- Are these listed as priorities in the Region's RICP
- Why are these important? Justification for grant applications!

Assesses Cybersecurity threats to radio systems

# Focus Group Survey

Submit **ONE** survey from each COG/RPC, Tribe and the Combined State Agencies

Where is the Focus Group Survey data used?

- Annual Report on Interoperable Communications to the Texas Legislature
- Determine new SCIP initiatives
- Texas SWIC Office markers and measures to DHS/ECD
- HSSP metrics for Texas Homeland Security Office
- Setting regional priorities for grant funding

## **Governance:**

84% of COGs reported they have an active Interop Communications Committee (last year: 73%)

84% of COGs reported they have met with regional decision-makers to promote interoperability

## **Planning and Procedures:**

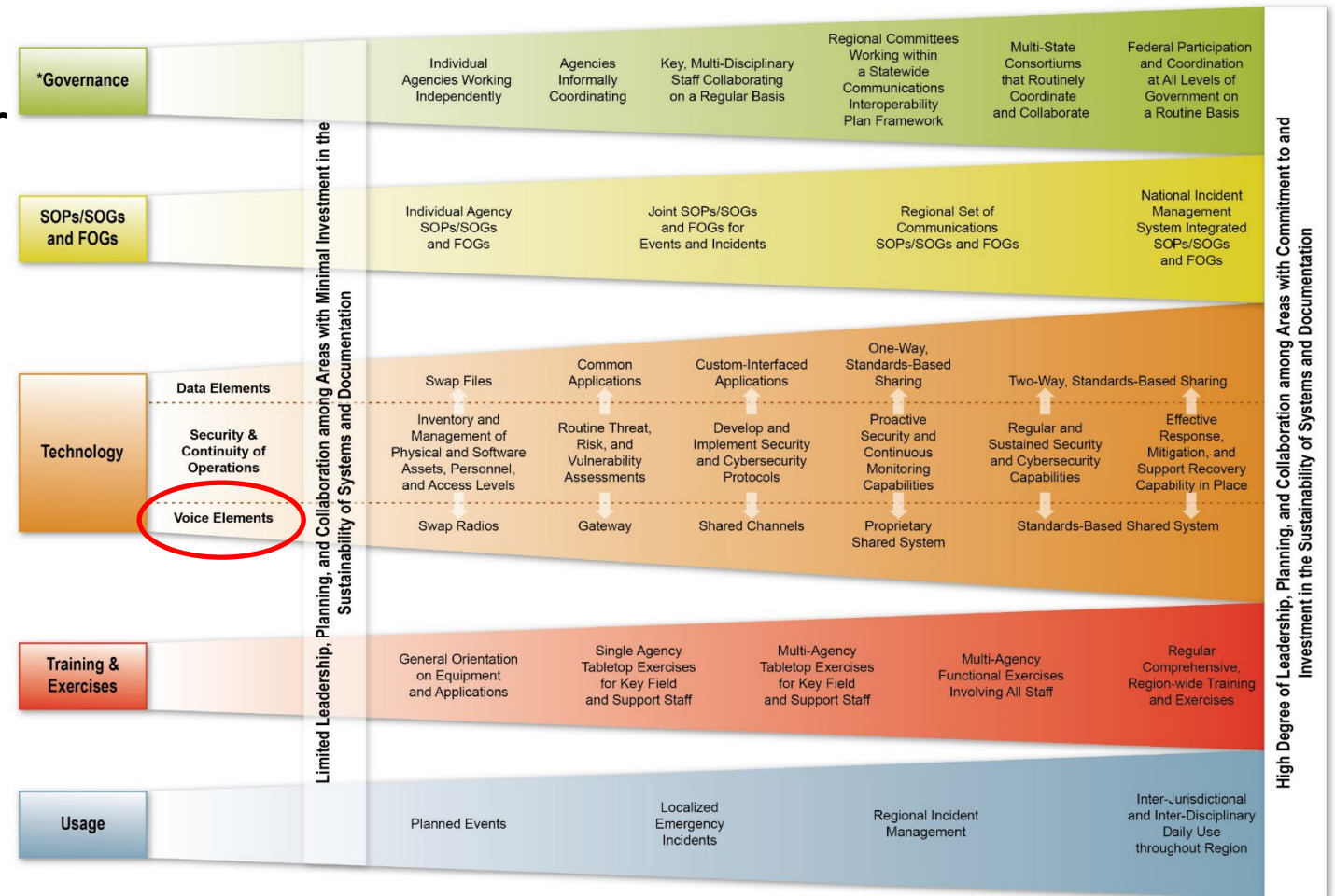
88% of Texas COGs participated in a public event displaying communications equipment. (last year: 56%)

68% of COGs and Tribes have or are in the process of updating their RICP within the last five years (last year: 60%)

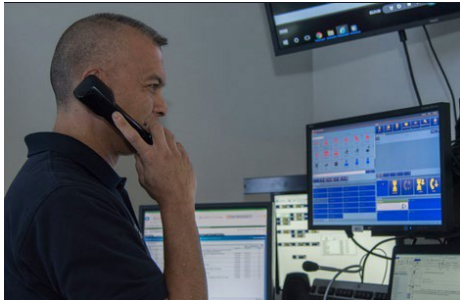
# What is the Interoperability Level Survey?

Provides a way to quantify the level of voice interoperability for each of the 254 counties

Questions are based on the SAFECOM Interoperability Continuum



# Interoperability Level – Voice Capabilities



Level 2: Console Patches



Level 3: Share Channel Programming  
(Most Common)



Level 4: **NON P25** Shared Radio System



Level 1: Swap Radios



Level 5: **P25** Shared Radio System

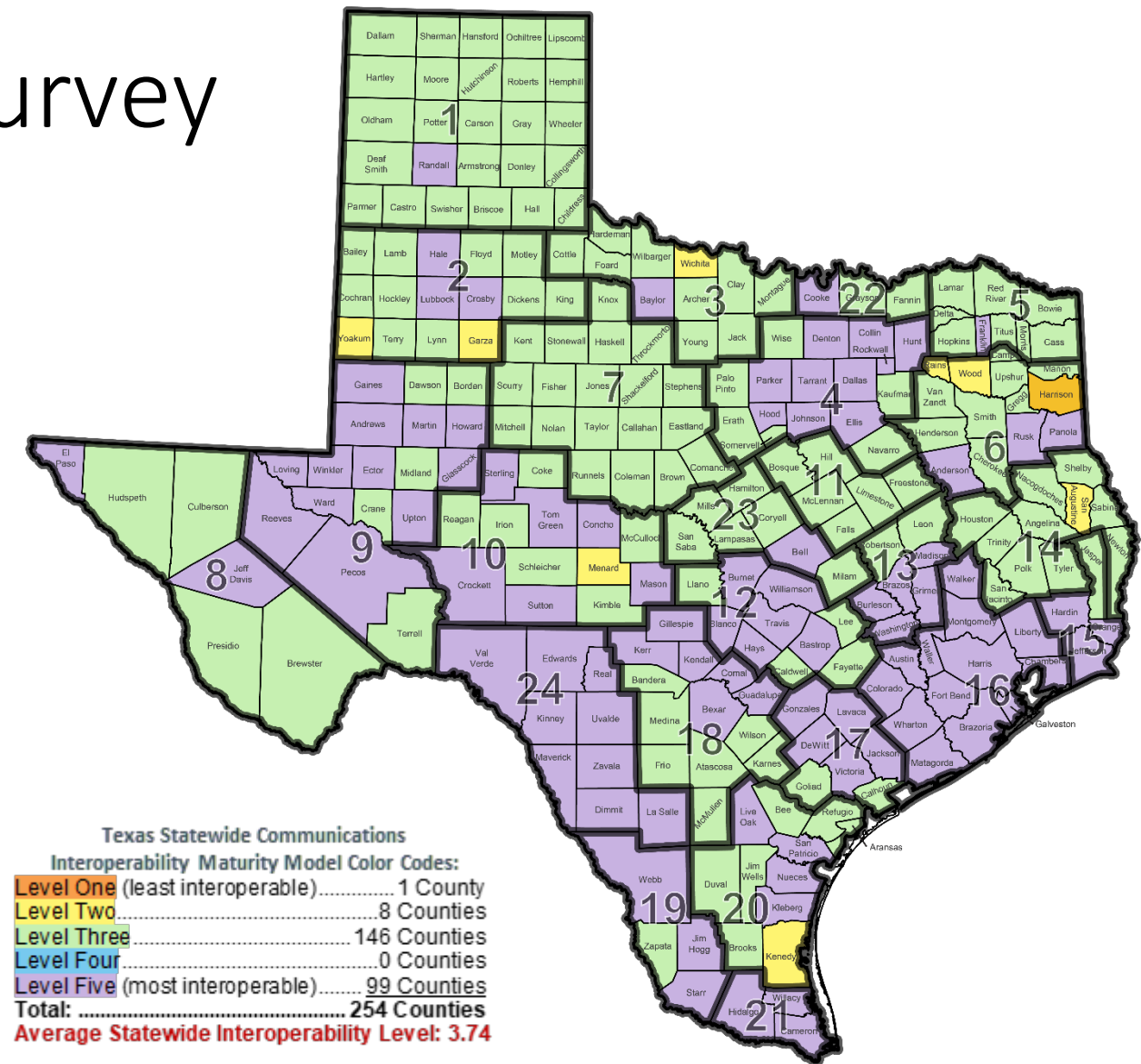
# Interoperability Level Survey

Designate **ONE** person/agency within the county to complete the survey – needs to understand communications capabilities within the county

Submit **ONE** survey per county that reports status based on the county as a whole.

Counties that do not submit a new Interoperability Level will remain the same as last year

COGs will be asked to clarify if multiple reports are submitted for a county, or if reported levels vary significantly from previous reports.



# Interoperability Level Survey

Where is the Interoperability Level Survey data used?

- The Voice Interoperability Level is used in the Legislative Report  
2010 the state reported an interoperability level of 3.2  
2024 the state reported an interoperability level of 3.74  
(down from 3.76 in the 2023 report)
- Knowing a counties' current Interoperability Level and how a grant project might improve that level could be important in a grant application
- No counties reported Level 4 Interoperability in 2024
