



Texas State Troopers are good men and women. These children know that troopers keep them safe. They are all friends.


Be safe

Help them find their way to the playground.




Always tell your parents where you are going, who you are with and when you will be back.

Be smart




If a stranger asks you to help find a pet, go for a ride, share some candy, or pose for a picture - don't go! Yell, "No!" and run home and tell your parents.


These friends look left. Then they look right. Then they look left again before crossing the street.

Be smart




These children know to ride their bikes on the right-hand side of the road and to obey all traffic signs.






Never ride in the bed of a pick-up truck, climb inside the cab and buckle up!

Be smart




Find the hidden message! "Be safe" and "Be smart" are hidden inside the picture.


Stay away from people who drink alcohol and drive.




IF you find a gun, follow these 4 steps!
