# MANDATED NIBRS REPORTING

#### What is HB 4879?

In June 2023, the 88th Legislature passed House Bill 4879, ushering in a new era of incident-based reporting. HB 4879 modifies Government Code 411.054 to **make NIBRS (National Incident-Based Reporting System) submissions to the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) program mandatory.** 

### What are the requirements?

ALL local law enforcement agencies must:

- 1. Adopt a NIBRS-compliant RMS (Records Management System).
- 2. Submit monthly NIBRS data to DPS UCR program using their ORI, or file 'zero reports' for no incidents.

### Who does it cover?

Per NIBRS guidelines, this applies to agencies that have personnel who are commissioned or licensed peace officers per the TCOLE definition who possess full arrest powers.

- TCOLE defines commissioned as -- Has been given the legal power to act as a peace officer or reserve, whether elected, employed, or appointed.
- TCOLE defines a peace officer as -- A person elected, employed, or appointed as a peace officer under the provisions of the Texas Occupations Code, §1701.001.
